RESOLUTION

Relative to the Tariff.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, an alteration in the tariff system is proposed in the House of Representatives of the United States, by the committee of ways and means, and is now under consideration in that body; *And whereas*, it is believed, that if the bill now under consideration should become a law, its operation will be very injurious to the great manufacturing interests of the country, and consequently, prejudicial to the interests of agriculture, and to the industry and prosperity of the people generally; Therefore,

Expression against proposed alteration of tariff.

Resolved by the Members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, That in their opinion, the bill now under consideration in the House of Representatives of the United States, ought not to become a law, and that no reduction of duties ought to be made, calculated to affect the successful prosecution of our domestic manufactures, or in any way to impair the faith of the government, by which the enterprize of our own citizens would be checked, and successful domestic competition retarded.

Transmission of resolution.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to transmit a copy of these resolutions to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, to be laid before their respective bodies.

Relative to the payment of Collectors and Toll-keepers on the Pennsylvania Canal.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the commissioners of the internal improvement fund be

and they are hereby authorized and directed to pay the amount due to collectors and toll-keepers on the several lines of the Pennsylvania canal, on the first day of January, 1833, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, out of any moneys arising from tolls on said canal, which sums so paid shall be refunded when money shall have been provided to meet the deficiency for the payment of collectors and lock-keepers.

Relative to the use of the water of the river Delaware.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, That the commissioners appointed, or to be appointed, in pursuance of the resolution passed on the tenth day of April last, be, and they are hereby authorized, to report how the obstructions in the river Delaware may be obviated, having due regard to a safe and convenient navigation of the river, and the use of the waters thereof for actual or contemplated improvements, without injury to the said navigation.
