An Act

To authorize a temporary loan for the use of the Commonwealth.

Temporary
loan authori-
zed, not to
exceed
\$250,000.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Governor be and he is hereby authorized to negotiate a temporary loan, on the credit of the Commonwealth, not to exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, at an interest not more than five per centum per annum, with any bank or banks, corporation, individual or individuals, as in his opinion may be most advantageous; and the sum or sums of money so borrowed shall be vested in the commissioners of the internal improvement fund, and applied to discharge the interest on canal loans falling due on the first of February next, and the money so borrowed shall be repaid to the lender or lenders within twelve months from the date of this act out of any moneys in the Treasury applicable to the payment of interest.

A Supplement
