An Act

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Sholl, of Bedford county; George Heydt and John Bause, of Berks county, Christian Mattis and Frederick Miller of Montgomery county, Christopher Hummel, of Venango county, Christopher Scott, of Mifflin county, and John Kochenderfer, of Lebanon county, soldiers of the revolution, or their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars to each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

An Act

To authorize Charles Roberts, guardian of Caleb C. and Henrietta Roberts, to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Charles Roberts of the city of Philadelphia, the guardian of his two minor children, Caleb C. and Henrietta Roberts, be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey in fee simple, or otherwise, or to let on ground rent, all or any part of the estate, right, title or interest of the said minors in and to a certain lot or piece of ground, situated on the north side of Callowhill street and west side of Eleventh
