An Act

Relative to the election of constables in Carroll and Nottingham townships, in Washington county, and election districts in Sewickly township, in Westmoreland county, and Carroll township, in Perry county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified electors residing in Carroll township, in Washington county, shall annually, on the same day and the same place where they meet to choose supervisors of the highways, elect four reputable citizens of said township for the office of constable, and return the names of the persons so elected to the then next court of Quarter Sessions of the said county; and the said court shall appoint the two highest in vote to be constables for the aforesaid township for one year from the time of their appointment; and the said constables so appointed shall furnish such security as is required by law, and in all respects be subject to the same regulations and penalties as is provided and contained in the several laws which now or hereafter may exist respecting constables in the several counties of this Commonwealth; and it is hereby made the duty of the acting constable, for the time being, of said township, to give legal notice and hold the election as directed by this act.

SECTION 2. From and after the passage of this act, the township of Carroll, in the county of Perry, shall be a separate election district, and the electors thereof shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Lewis Mickey, in said township; and the election for officers of said township shall be held at the same place, until otherwise ordered by the citizens of said township, in manner prescribed by law.

SECTION 3. The electors of the township of Sewickly, in the county of Westmoreland, are hereby authorized to hold an election at the house of Elizabeth Carnahan, in said township, on the twentieth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, and elect by ballot a constable, supervisors, and other township officers, for said township, who shall hold their offices until others are elected and qualified according to the act of the General Assembly, entitled "An act relating to counties and townships and county and township officers," passed the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four; and for the purpose of holding said election, Samuel M'Grew, esquire, of said township, is hereby appointed judge, who shall give notice of the said election, at least eight days before said election shall be held, by at least five written or

printed advertisements, put up at the most public places in said township.

SECTION 4. The first section of the act entitled "An act to increase the number of constables in Washington and Cumberland counties," passed the sixteenth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, authorizing and requiring the election and appointment of two constables in Nottingham township, in Washington county, is hereby repealed.

An Act

To authorize the Canal Commissioners to fill up the Deep Cut at the Grant's Hill tunnel.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required, within the present year, to cause to be filled up the deep cut at and above the Grant's Hill tunnel, in the city of Pittsburg, and to extend the arch of the tunnel, from its southern termination, to the arch of the bridge on Fourth street.

SECTION 2. The right of soil above the arch of the tunnel shall revert and be invested in the owner or owners of land through which the said tunnel and deep cut have been dug, subject to the right of passing through said tunnel.

SECTION 3. It shall be lawful for the owner or owners of any land through which said tunnel or deep cut passes, to give notice to the deputy attorney general for the county of Allegheny, and to the mayor of the city of Pittsburg, that on a day certain five arbitrators, non-residents of the city of Pittsburg or county of Allegheny, will be chosen at the office of the prothonotary of said county, in the manner provided by the act of the twentieth March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, entitled "An act regulating arbitrations," to ascertain and determine the amount of damages, if any, which have been sus-
