

stone, gravel, clay or other materials as may be necessary and proper in their opinion to repair the said rail-road or any part thereof. And if the said president and directors and the owner of the land cannot agree upon the compensation to be made for any injury or supposed injury that may be done to the said land by such entry or occupation, the same shall be assessed under the provisions of the seventy-ninth and eightieth sections of the act to which this is a supplement.

Company compelled to commence at Harrisburg at same time the road is commenced at any other point.

Mountjoy construed to mean the town of Mountjoy.

Style of Corporation.

SECTION 12. The said president and managers shall be compelled to commence operations at the borough of Harrisburg at the same time that the making of the said road is commenced at any other point, and complete said extension with the same expedition that any other part is completed, or on neglect or failure so to do, all the authority, rights and privileges hereby granted by this act shall be forfeited at the expiration of two years from its passage, and the same be null and void.

SECTION 13. The word Mountjoy in the seventy-seventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall be construed to mean the town of Mountjoy, in the county of Lancaster.

SECTION 14. From and after the passage of this act, the style of the said corporation shall be the "Harrisburg, Portsmouth, Mountjoy and Lancaster rail-road company."

An Act

Authorizing the election and appointment of an additional constable in the township of North Sewickly, in the county of Beaver, and for other purposes.

Election of constables in N. Sewickly township, in co. of Beaver, and unincorp. township of the N. Liberties in Philad. co.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors of North Sewickly township, in the county of Beaver, and the electors of the unincorporated township of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, shall annually hereafter, at the place where they meet for the

election of township officers on the day appointed for the election of constables in the several townships in the Commonwealth, elect four respectable citizens of the said townships and return the names of the persons so elected to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the said county, two of whom shall be appointed constables for each of the said townships, in the same manner, with the like power and authority and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing or that may hereafter exist concerning constables in this Commonwealth; and the acting constable of said township is authorized and required to give previous notice of and to hold the first election under this act on the third Friday of March next.

SECTION 2. The qualified electors of the borough of Shrewsbury, in the county of York, shall at the same time and place they elect their borough officers, elect two respectable citizens of said borough and return the names of the persons thus elected to the next Court of Quarter Sessions of the said county, one of whom shall be appointed by the court to serve as constable in the same manner, with like power and authority and subject to the same regulations and penalties, and give like security as is provided and contained in the laws now existing or as may hereafter be enacted concerning constables within this Commonwealth, and shall serve and execute all manner of process which may by law be directed to and served by township constables with like effect, and shall receive for executing such process like fees as township constables are now by law entitled to receive. And the constable so appointed shall do and perform all the duties required to be done by the high constable of said borough, in pursuance of the act of incorporation and of the by-laws and ordinances of said borough.

SECTION 3. That the time of holding the election of borough officers for the said borough of Shrewsbury, be and the same is hereby changed from the second Friday of May to the third Friday of March in each and every year.

SECTION 4. The taxable inhabitants of the borough of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster, shall meet at the town hall in the said borough at the time now fixed for holding the annual elections for inspectors and assessors in the several boroughs and townships in this Commonwealth, and at the next annual election and annually thereafter elect one inspector to serve for said borough at the ensuing general election, and also one assessor and two assistant assessors, whose duty it shall be to assess all real and personal property in said borough for county rates and levies, and also under the direction of the borough council to assess on all property in said borough, for borough taxes, any tax not exceeding twenty-five cents in the hundred dollars valuation, except a majority of the taxable inhabitants shall decide that a higher tax be laid, as provided in the charter of said

borough, and that the said borough is hereby declared to be separated from the township of West Hempfield, in which the same is situated, for the purposes herein mentioned.

SECTION 5. It shall and may be lawful for all persons entitled by law to vote for burgess and other officers of the borough of Mercer, in the county of Mercer, at their annual election for the election of township officers, and every year thereafter to elect four persons, being citizens of said borough, for the office of constable, and a true return thereof shall be made to the next Court of Quarter Sessions for said county; and the court shall thereupon appoint two of them to serve as constables of said borough, with all the authorities and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing, or that may be passed hereafter, concerning constables within this Commonwealth.

SECTION 6. So much of the act entitled An act to encourage the destruction of foxes in the counties of Allegheny, Cambria, York, Mercer, Union, Huntingdon, Luzerne and Schuylkill, passed the fourth day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, as relates to the county of York, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the treasurer of said county shall pay the premium on fox scalps in the same manner and amount as if the aforesaid act had not been passed.
