SECTION 5. It shall and may be lawful for all persons entitled by law to vote for burgess and other officers of the borough of Mercer, in the county of Mercer, at their annual election for the election of township officers, and every year thereafter to elect four persons, being citizens of said borough, for the office of constable, and a true return thereof shall be made to the next Court of Quarter Sessions for said county; and the court shall thereupon appoint two of them to serve as constables of said borough, with all the authorities and subject to the same regulations and penalties as are provided and contained in the laws now existing, or that may be passed hereafter, concerning constables within this Commonwealth.

SECTION 6. So much of the act entitled An act to encourage the destruction of foxes in the counties of Allegheny, Cambria, York, Mercer, Union, Huntingdon, Luzerne and Schuylkill, passed the fourth day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-two, as relates to the county of York, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the treasurer of said county shall pay the premium on fox scalps in the same manner and amount as if the aforesaid act had not been passed.

### An Act

To authorize the Governor to incorporate a company to erect a toll bridge over the West Branch of the river Susquehanna, at Walton's landing.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Jonathan Smith, John Peal, John Goutner, Robert Risk, Isaac Bruner, Frederick Ditrich, John Montgomery, jr., <sup>Commissioners</sup> William Taggart, William Piatt, Henry Escroyd and Thomas Maxwell, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to do and perform the several duties hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, they shall, on or before the first day of November next, procure one or more books, and therein enter as follows: "We, whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company for erecting a bridge over the West Branch of the Susquehanna, at Walton's landing, the sum of twenty-five dollars for every share of stock in the said <sup>Shares \$25.</sup> company set opposite to our respective names, in such manner and proportions and at such times as shall be determined by the president and managers, in pursuance of an act of the General Assembly, entitled 'An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate a company to erect a toll bridge over the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, at Walton's landing.'" And shall thereupon proceed to receive subscriptions for the stock of the said company, at such times and places as they shall think proper: *Provided always,* That every person so subscribing, <sup>Proviso.</sup> in his own name or in the name of any other person, shall previously pay, to the attending commissioners, two dollars for <sup>\$2 to be paid</sup> every share so subscribed, out of which shall be paid the ex- <sup>on every share</sup> pense of taking such subscriptions and other incidental charges; <sup>subscribed.</sup> and the remainder shall be paid over to the treasurer of the
