

shall be permitted to serve as constable more than three years in any term of six years, is hereby repealed, so far as the same relates to the borough of Carlisle, in the county of Cumberland, so that any person elected by the people of the said borough to the said office of constable, or who shall hereafter be elected to said office, shall serve in such office as if the said act had never been passed.

SECTION 3. So much of any act of Assembly as is hereby altered or supplid, is hereby repealed.

An Act

For the relief of sundry soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Nicholas Kantner of Berks county, Christian C. Acker of Lehigh county, Casper Warfle of Philadelphia county, Daniel Steever of Dauphin county, Thomas Sillyman of Northampton county, Ann Craswell of Crawford county, Mary Bradford of Montgomery county, Eliza Jacobs of Luzerne county, Christian Markle and Martin Ritter of Northumberland county, Peter Wolf of Lehigh county, Samuel Mehaffey of Westmoreland county, Ebenezer Byers of Mercer county, Margaret Sheffy, George Drehs and Jemima Murry of Montgomery county, Mary M'Kee of Armstrong county, Daniel Morrison of Lancaster county, Frederick Bodine of the State of New York, Samuel Withrow of Franklin county, Isaiah Vanhorn of Indiana county, Sophia Barnhart of Montgomery county, Catharine Fell of Luzerne county, and Margaret Maxwell of Huntingdon county, soldiers and widows of revolutionary soldiers, or to their respective orders, forty dollars to each immediately and another forty dollars to each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

An Act

To annul the marriage contract of Charles Crillon Barton and Anna his wife.
