

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for either party, in the aforesaid action of ejectment, now pending in the Court of Common Pleas of the said county, wherein the said Jacob Hoffman is plaintiff, and John G. Coster and others are defendants, to remove the same into the court of any adjacent county; which action so removed, shall be proceeded in by the proper court, in like manner and subject to like rules and proceedings, as if it had remained in the court in which it was originally brought, and upon final judgment *testatem habere facias possrsionem*, and *testatem* executions may issue as in other cases: *Provided,* That the plaintiff or defen- Parties may remove acti'n of ejectment to any adjac't county.  
 dants so removing shall first take and subscribe an oath or affirmation before one of the judges of the court of said county, to be filed of record, with the cause that such removal is not made for the purpose of delay, but because he or they firmly believe, a fair and impartial trial cannot be had in the said county of Schuylkill. Proviso.

### An Act

To incorporate the Philadelphia Association for the relief of disabled Firemen.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every person, who shall at the time of the passing of this act be members of the association called the "Philadelphia Association for the relief of disabled firemen," shall be, and they are hereby created and declared to be, one body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title of the "Philadelphia Association for the relief of disabled firemen;" Style.  
 and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall

**Privileges & liabilities.** be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattles, of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of; and also, to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also to ordain, establish and put in execution, such by-laws, ordinances and regulations, as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this Commonwealth; and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof: *Provided*, That the yearly rents and profits of the real estate held by the said corporation, shall not exceed the sum of six thousand dollars.

**Proviso.**

SECTION 2. The following shall be the fundamental articles of said corporation:

**Relief.** Article I. The object of the association shall be the relief of disabled firemen, their widows and orphans, and the relief of persons not firemen, who may sustain personal injury by fire apparatus.

**Board of trust's, when chosen.** Article II. The government of the association shall be vested in a board of twenty-one trustees, to be chosen in January of each and every year, who shall have power to elect their own officers, and to require satisfactory bonds from the treasurer for the faithful performance of his duties.

**Funds permanently invested.** Article III. The funds of the association shall be permanently invested, and the interest arising therefrom shall be appropriated to no other objects than those for which the society is instituted.
