A N A C T

Authorizing John Prall, to sell and convey certain real estate in Bucks county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That John Prall, the sole surviving trustee named in a certain deed of conveyance dated

day of November, seventeen hundred and ninety-seven, is hereby authorized and empowered to sell at public sale, and to convey and assure to the purchaser or purchasers in fee simple, all that piece or lot of ground with the appurtenances, situate in the township of Middletown, and county of Bucks, on the west side of the road leading from Attleborough to Bristol, beginning at a corner of Lewis Rue and John Prall's land, thence by said Prall's land three perches to a corner, thence by land of Gabriel Vanhorn three perches to a corner, thence by the same three perches to a corner in the line of Lewis Rue's land, thence by the same three perches to the place of beginning, containing nine perches more or less, together with one perch in breadth, for a passage from the said lot or piece of ground, along the line of the said Lewis Rue's land to the aforesaid road.

SECTION 2. That the said John Prall, surviving trustee as aforesaid, shall as soon as practicable after the passage of this act, proceed to sell the aforesaid lot or piece of ground, with

the appurtenances at public sale, and make and execute under his hand and seal, a good and sufficient title to the purchaser ^{To make deed} or purchasers for the same, and such deed being duly executed, shall pass all the interests vested in all the trustees mentioned in the aforesaid deed of trusts.

SECTION 3. That the proceeds arising from the sale of the premises, aforesaid, shall be paid by the said John Prall, to ^{Application of} the board of school directors, of the township of Middletown ^{proceeds of} aforesaid, who shall apply the same to common school purposes, (and no other) as other school funds of said township are by law expended and applied.

SECTION 4. That the high constable of the borough of ^{High constable of} Hollidaysburg, in the county of Huntingdon, shall hereafter ^{Hollidaysburg} be appointed by the burgess and town council of said borough, who are also authorized to supply any vacancies that ^{to be appoin'd} may hereafter occur in said office, and so much of the act incorporating said borough as conflicts with the forgoing provisions is hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That the present president, directors and treasurer of the company, for erecting a permanent bridge over the river Schuylkill, at or near the city of Philadelphia, are hereby ^{President &c of Schuylkill} continued in office until officers shall be chosen, and be in ^{bridge near} office ^{Phila contin'd} vested with the same powers, authorities and privileges as ^{in office} fully, to all intents and purposes as if elections for the officers of the company had been held in the usual manner, under the charter of the said company.

SECTION 6. That the commissioners of the district of Spring Garden, in the county of Philadelphia, are hereby authorized to pass ordinances regulating the running at large of swine, within the said district as they may see proper. ^{S Garden}

SECTION 7. That so much of an act, entitled "A further supplement to an act, entitled an act to amend and consolidate with its supplements, the act entitled, an act for the recovery of debts and demands not exceeding one hundred dollars, before a justice of the peace, and for the election of constables, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, as prohibits any person from serving as constable, or deputy constable for more than two years, in any term of three years, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as it relates to the township of Upper Saucon, in the county of Lehigh. ^{Constables of Upper Saucon Lehigh co}

SECTION 8. That hereafter when any action is commenced by any person or persons, or bodies corporate, against an incorporated rail road or canal company, in any county in which the corporate property of such company is wholly or in part situated, it shall be lawful, if the president, treasurer, secretary, or chief clerk of such corporation does not reside, or cannot be found in such county, for the sheriff, or other officer to whom ^{Actions against railr'd or canal com'p}

How process such process is directed to serve the same, on any manager or may be served director of such company, being in such county, and the service so made shall be deemed sufficient, and in case no director or manager can be found in the county, it shall be lawful for such officer to go into an adjoining county to serve the process as hereinbefore stated.
