AN ACT

Incorporating the Union Church and School, in the village of New Holland, in the county of York.

Society incor-
porated

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That a corporation is hereby created, which shall be called by the name, style and title of the "Union Church and School Society of New Holland," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in all courts of law and elsewhere, and shall be able and capable in law and equity to take, hold and receive, to them and their successors, for the use of the said society, lands, tenements, goods and chattels, of whatsoever kind, nature, or quality, real, personal or mixed, which is now, or shall, or may at any time hereafter become the property of the said society, or to be held for their use by gifts, grants, bargains, sales, conveyance, devise, bequest or otherwise, from any person or persons whomsoever capable of making the same, and to grant, bargain, sell, mortgage, improve, or dispose of for the use of the said society: *Provided,* That the yearly value or income of the said estate shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars, and shall not be appropriated to any other than benevolent or religious uses.

SECTION 2. The business of the said society shall be conducted by three trustees and one secretary, which trustees may appoint a treasurer, and such other officers as they

may from time to time deem necessary, for the better government of the said society, and until others are or shall be elected as is hereinafter provided, the following named persons shall be trustees, viz: George Wogan, Adam Wolf and Philip Smith, to continue in office until the first Saturday in January, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, on which day the male members of said society shall elect three trustees, and one secretary, and on the same day annually thereafter elect three trustees and one secretary, who shall serve one year and until others are elected, and if vacancies by death or otherwise shall happen in the office of trustees, the remaining trustee or trustees, may appoint others to supply such vacancy or vacancies, until the next general meeting of said society when another trustee or trustees shall be elected, to serve until the next annual election, and if the society neglect on the day of the annual meeting to hold their election as is hereinbefore directed, the said corporation shall not be dissolved, but a majority of the trustees may appoint any subsequent day, on which the election may be held: *Provided*, That notice thereof may be given in such manner as a majority of the trustees may think proper to direct, and at least ten days before said election, and any male member of said society, at least twenty-one years of age, and who shall have paid at least twenty-five cents per annum for the support of said church and school shall be entitled to vote for trustees and secretary.

SECTION 3. The said trustees and their successors, shall have full power to enact and enforce such by-laws and ordinances as they shall think proper, for the regulation and transaction of the business of the said society, and shall have power also to change the time of holding the general election, if the same should be deemed advisable: *Provided*, That the said by-laws and ordinances shall not be inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, or of the United States: *Provided further*, That the said corporation shall not dispose of, alien, sell, or in any way incumber the real estate belonging to the said church or school, nor purchase any real estate for the use of said church or school society, unless with the consent of a majority of the members of said society entitled to vote as aforesaid, who shall meet and determine upon such sale incumbrance or purchase as shall have been proposed.

SECTION 4. The State Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay out of the money remaining in the school fund, for the use of Manchester district, York county, the sum of two hundred dollars, to the trustees of the said Union Church and School Society of New Holland, to be applied by them to the keeping of the building, of which they are trustees in repair,

and to the improvement of the means of education therein :
Provided, That should the said district of Manchester here-
 after accept the school law, the directors shall be entitled to
 use the Union Church and School of New Holland free of
 expense.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the several acts relating to Auctions and Auctioneers, and for
 other puposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of
 Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in
 General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the au-
 thority of the same*, That from and after the first day of May
 next, when any citizens of this state residing in the city or
 county of Philadelphia, shall have paid into the treasury of
 this commonwealth, the sum of seven hundred dollars, and
 shall have filed in the office of the Secretary of the Common-
 wealth, his bond, with two or more sufficient securities, to be
 approved of in the manner provided in the acts to which this
 is a supplement, in the penal sum of three thousand dollars,
 conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of an
 auctioneer, and for the payment of all duties and taxes which
 may become due to the state in consequence of his exercising
 the trade or occupation of an auctioneer, the Governor shall
 thereupon grant to such citizen a commission in legal form,
 authorizing him to make sales by auction, according to law,
 at any place within two miles of the state house in the city of
 Philadelphia, of all and every kind of merchandize, estate and
 property, except cotton, wool, rice, indigo, groceries, liquors,
 dry goods, drugs, dyes, medicines, paints, bark, hides, oil,
 fish, horses, cattle, carriages, and other vehicles, for the term
 of one year, from the date of such commission.
