AN ACT

To repeal the fifth section of the act of eleventh March, eighteen hundred and forty, entitled "An act to re-establish the District Court for the city and county of Lancaster, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the fifth section of the act passed and approved on the eleventh March, eighteen hundred and forty, entitled "An act to re-establish the District Court, for the city and county of Lancaster," be and the same is hereby repealed, **Repeal** and that so much of the third section of the act, passed and approved on the eighth of April, eighteen hundred and forty-one, restoring the original jurisdiction of the court of common pleas, of Lancaster county, as extends to the said court, the fifth section of the act of eleventh March, eighteen hundred and forty, re-establishing the District Court in the city and county of Lancaster, be and the same is hereby repealed, so that from and after the passage of this act, there shall be no affidavits of defence required in any suit brought in any court **Affidavits of** of Lancaster county, to prevent a judgment by default, but defence judgments by default in all cases may be entered as they were used to be, before the passage of the sections of the two acts hereby repealed.
