Relative to the last will of William M. Camac.

WHEREAS, William Masters Camac of Penn township, Philadelphia county, deceased, lately died seized of certain real estate, situated in said county, and also of certain other real estate lying and being in the kingdom of Ireland, having first made and published his last will and testament in writing, and certain codicils thereto, duly executed, wherein and whereby, among other things he did empower his trustees here to make sale of his real estate in the said county, and also did direct and empower certain other trustees therein named, within the term of two years from the time of his decease, to make sale of his said real estate, lying and being in the said kingdom of Ireland, and further directed the payment of all his debts, from and out of the proceeds of his said Irish estates, on which he charged the same: AND WHEREAS, The said last will and testament, and the codicils thereto have been duly proved, and are on file in the office of the Register of Wills, for the city and county of Philadelphia, and the executors named in said will have taken upon themselves the due execution thereof: AND WHEREAS, the production of said original will and codicils is required before the proper tribunal, in the said kingdom of Ireland or England, in order to their due probate therein, and to the execution of the trusts thereof, particularly in order to the due sale and perfection of the title thereupon, to the purchaser or purchasers of said Irish estates.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Register of Wills for the city and county of Philadelphia, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to deliver the said original last will and testament of the said William Masters Camac, deceased with the codicils thereto, to the executors thereof, for the purpose of being by them forwarded to Ireland or England for due probate there: *Provided,* That the said Register shall, prior to the delivery by him of said will and codicils as aforesaid, cause to be made at the costs of said executors, one other full, correct and complete copy of said will and codicils, and of the probate thereof, in addition to the copy usually transcribed into the books of said office, which said copy shall be certified to be a full, correct and complete copy of said original will and codicils, and

probate thereof by the Register of Wills, under the seal of his office, and which shall be retained by the said Register in his said office, as a substitute for said original will, codicils and probate so delivered by him as aforesaid, and shall be filed by said Register in the place and stead of said original will, codicils and probate.

SECTION 2. All office copies and exemplifications of the said certified and retained copy, shall be deemed held and taken in all legal proceedings, and in all cases, and for every purpose, to be of the same force and effect as official copies, and exemplifications of said original will, codicils and probate, and shall be received on all trials at law or in equity, and in other cases as evidence in like manner as certified copies of the said originals would be, and full faith and credit and effect shall be given thereto, any thing in any act of assembly or law, or usage of this Commonwealth to the contrary notwithstanding.

AN ACT

To repeal the act passed May third, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act in relation to the Philadelphia and Trenton Rail Road Company."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the act passed the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act in relation to the Philadelphia and Trenton rail road company," be and the same is hereby repealed: *Provided,* That the said company shall be compensated by the commissioners of the district of Kensington, for any expenses which may have been
