AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract between C. Glenn Peebles and Emily A. Peebles his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract heretofore entered into between C. Glenn Peebles and Emily A. Peebles his wife, be and the same is hereby declared null and void, and the parties discharged from all the obligations and liabilities growing out of the same, as fully and absolutely as if they had never been joined in marriage.
