A N A C T

To incorporate the Decatur Fire Company, of the borough of Frankford,
in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every person that shall at the time of passing this act, be members of the association called the Decatur Fire Company of Frankford, shall be and they are hereby declared to be one body politic and corporate in law, by the name, style and title of "The Decatur Fire Company of Frankford," and by the same name, shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere; and to take, receive and hold all and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments which may at any time or times heretofore, have been granted, bargained, sold, enfeoffed, released, devised or otherwise conveyed to the said Decatur Fire Company of Frankford, or to any person or persons for their use, or in trust for them and the same lands and tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments, are hereby vested and established in the said corporation, and their successors forever, and the said corporation and their successors, are hereby declared to be seized and possessed of such estate or estates herein, as in and by the respective grants, bargains, sales, enfeoffments, releases, devises, or other conveyances thereof, is or are declared limited and expressed, and also that the said corporation and their successors at all times hereafter, shall be able to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy to them and their successors all and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments, goods and chattels of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien and dispose of: *Provido* *Provided*, That the clear yearly value of the messuages, houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities, or other hereditaments, and the real estate of the said corporation, and the interest on money by them lent, shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars, and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure, and also to ordain, establish and put in execution, such by-laws, ordinances By laws

and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to the constitution and laws of the United States or of this Commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.

Banking prohibited SECTION 2. Nothing in this act contained shall be deemed to authorize the said company to engage either directly or indirectly, in any banking, monied, commercial, mining or manufacturing concern, or to act in any other way than as a fire company.

Repeal SECTION 3. The legislature reserves the right to amend, alter or annul the chartered privileges granted by this act.

A N A C T

To incorporate the village of New Germantown, in the county of Perry, into a borough.

Name SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the village of New Germantown, in the county of Perry, shall be and the same hereby is erected into a borough, which shall be called the borough of New Germantown, and shall be bounded and limited as follows

Boundaries viz: Beginning at a post on the western boundary line of lands of Simeon Kern, and the north east corner of said village, thence north ninety-six perches by lands of said Kern, and along the eastern boundary of said town to a post, thence due west ninety-six perches along the northern boundary of said town to a post, thence due south ninety-six perches along the western boundary of said town to a post, thence due east
