AN ACT

Supplementary to an act, entitled "An act erecting a new county out of the northern part of Luzerne county, to be called Wyoming.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the lines separating the county of Wyoming from the county of Luzerne, shall be and the same are hereby established as follows, viz: Beginning on the south line of Susquehanna county where said line now crosses the North Branch of the Tunkhannock creek, thence down said creek with its natural channel to the western line of Benton township, thence on the line between the townships of Benton and Nicholson, to the south east corner of Nicholson township, thence westerly the same course with the principal line between Benton and Nicholson, to the southerly line of Abington township, thence eastwardly with the line between the townships of Abington and Falls two miles, and thence westerly to the Flat Rock Rift, in the Susquehanna river, between the townships of Falls and Exeter (as described in the act, to which this is a supplement,) and from thence a southwesterly course to the south east corner of Monroe township, thence west on a line parallel with the south line of Susquehanna county, to the line of Lycoming county, and thence with the Lycoming, Bradford and Susquehanna county line as they now are, and as described in the act, to which this is a supplement to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2. That John Boyle, of Susquehanna county, Henry Colt, of Luzerne county, and George Mack of Columbia county, or a majority of them be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to survey, measure and mark the line mentioned in the first section of this act, and shall make a draft or plot thereof, and transmit the same to the governor, to be filed in the office of the secretary of state. And the said commissioners shall be paid for their services the sum of two dollars per day: *Provided,* That the expense of surveying, measuring and marking the said line from the line of Susquehanna county, to the Flat Rock Rift, in the Susquehanna river, shall not be chargeable to the county of Wyoming, but the balance of the expense aforesaid, shall be paid as is provided in the act

A N A C T

To incorporate the Mercantile Library Company of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Mercantile Library Company of Philadelphia, is hereby enacted into a body politic and corporate in deed and in law, by the name, style and title of the **Name** "Mercantile Library Company of Philadelphia," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, be capable of suing and being sued, to have a common seal, and the same to alter **Seal** or renew at pleasure, and shall be able and capable in law and equity, to take and hold for the use of said company, any real estate, goods, chattels and sum or sums of money, by gift, grant, bargain, sale, will, devise or bequest or otherwise, from any **Rights and privileges** person or persons whomsoever capable of making the same, and the same to grant, bargain, sell, and a good conveyance make for the use of the said Library, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which may be lawful and necessary for them to do, for the well being and due management of the affairs thereof.

SECTION 2. That this corporation shall consist of all such persons as are now members, or shall be hereafter admitted as **Members** such, agreeable to the by-laws of said company.
