A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to settle the estate of John Nicholson and Peter Baynton."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the jurisdiction of "the Nicholson Court of pleas, for the state of Pennsylvania," shall not be construed to extend to any lands to which the board constituted by act of assembly, passed the eleventh of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five, entitled "An act for the sale of lands, late the estate of John Nicholson and Peter Baynton, on which the state has a lien, and for other purposes," and the supplement thereto, passed the fifth of April, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, have certified that the Commonwealth has no lien or claim, and the powers and authority of the commissioners constituted by the act of assembly, creating the said court, passed the sixteenth of April, eighteen hundred and forty, shall not extend to any interference with such lands.
