RESOLUTION

Explanatory of the act of the fourth May, eighteen hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act to provide revenue to meet the demands on the Treasury, and for other purposes."

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met*, That the eighth section of the act, entitled "An act to provide revenue to meet the demands on the Treasury, and for other purposes," passed May, eighteen hundred and forty-one, shall not be construed to authorize the collectors of tolls on the Philadelphia and Columbia rail road, to receive any other currency than specie for the transportation of the mail on said road.

RESOLUTION

Relative to certain lots of ground in the borough of York.

WHEREAS, By deed dated the eleventh day of June, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and sixteen, the proprietors of Springetsbury Manor granted to the burgesses and in-

habitants of the borough of York, a certain tract of ground, situated in said borough, bounded north by New street, east by George street, south by lands of Samuel Ilgenfritz, Christian Hildebrand, and Imfelt's heirs, and west by Water street, and containing about twenty acres, "To have and to hold the said twenty acre tract or lot of ground above described unto the burgesses and inhabitants of the borough of York, to be kept as an open public common forever for the use of the said borough, and to and for no other use, intent or purpose whatsoever, except as to one range of lots fronting on George street and two hundred and fifty feet in depth respectively, which, with the concurrence of the Legislature, at any future time the said corporation may sell at their discretion ;

And whereas, Petitions have been presented to the burgesses of said borough, signed by a large majority of the taxable inhabitants of said borough, praying that the said range of lots fronting on George street may be sold ; therefore,

RESOLVED, By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, 'That the legislature does consent to the sale of the said "range of lots of ground fronting on George street, and two hundred and fifty feet in depth respectively," by the corporation of the borough of York : *Provided*, That the proceeds of such sale, so far as the same may be necessary for that purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the debt of said corporation.
