A RESOLUTION

Authorizing the Superintendent of Motive Power on the Philadelphia and Columbia Rail Road, to pay certain moneys to the widow of John B. Menough.

WHEREAS, John B. Menough, late a car agent upon the Philadelphia and Columbia rail road, died in consequence of injuries received by a car running over him whilst engaged in the service of the Commonwealth : *And whereas*, There was due to the said John B. Menough from the Commonwealth, fifty dollars and eighty-seven cents, for forty-four days service, and it appears that the same is the only known debt due from any source to the estate, and the expense of administering to the said estate by the widow of the said John B. Menough, would amount to nearly the sum which is due by the Commonwealth. Therefore be it

Preamble

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met*, That the superintendent of motive power upon the Philadelphia and Columbia rail road, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the widow of John B. Menough, Mrs. Menough, the sum due the said deceased, by the Commonwealth, in full for compensation due him as agent upon the said road.
