Changing the time of holding the courts in the sixteenth judicial district of this commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the passage of this act, the time for the commencement of the several courts for the counties composing the sixteenth judicial district of this commonwealth, shall be as follows, to wit: The courts for the county of Franklin, shall commence, and be held on the second Monday in April, the second Monday in August, the last Monday in October, the third Monday in January, to continue two weeks, if necessary: in the county of Bedford, on the fourth Monday in April, the fourth Monday in August, the second in November, and the first Monday in February: in the county of Somerset, on the Mondays next succeeding the days hereinbefore fixed for the commencement of the courts in Bedford county; and the writs of venire and other writs, as well as all precepts whatsoever, which have already or may hereafter be issued in the counties above named, shall be made returnable, agreeably to the times fixed for holding the courts by this act.
