A N A C T

To erect the township of White, in the county of Indiana, into a separate election district.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the township of White, in the county of Indiana, shall hereafter form one election district, for general election purposes, and the qualified electors of said township shall hold their special and general elections at the court house in the borough of Indiana.

SECTION 2. That the qualified electors of said township, shall meet at the aforesaid place of election, at the usual time of electing township officers in said county, next ensuing the passage of this act, and annually thereafter, and then and there elect such officers as by the laws of this commonwealth, are required to be elected in the several townships of said county. Annual election.

SECTION 3. That Samuel Trimble, be and he is hereby authorized and required to act as judge, and Robert McLanahan and John Rice, as inspectors of the next ensuing spring elections in said township, and they shall perform the same duties, receive the same pay, and be subject to the same responsibilities as officers of elections in similar cases. Election officers.

SECTION 4. That it shall be lawful for the qualified electors of said township, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and whenever thereafter, by the laws of this commonwealth, it may become necessary to elect at the time and place fixed for the election of constable, in said township, two citizens of said township, to serve as justices of the peace therein. Justices.

Auditors. SECTION 5. That at the next spring elections for said township, there shall be three persons elected to serve as auditors of said township, one of whom shall hold said office for one year; one for two years; and one for three years; and it shall be the duty of the persons so elected, at their first meeting, to determine by lot, the length of time that each shall remain in office.

School directors. SECTION 6. That at the elections aforesaid, there shall also be six persons elected to serve as a board of school directors of said township, two of whom shall continue in said office for one year; two for two years; and two for three years; and it shall be the duty of the persons so elected at the first meeting of the said board, to determine by lot, the length of time that each shall remain in office.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "Act Act authorizing the governor to incorporate a company for making an artificial road from the bank of the Susquehanna river, opposite Harrisburg, to Pittsburg."

Preamble. WHEREAS, By an act supplementary to the act above recited, passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, the number of managers to be elected and appointed for each and every turnpike road, and bridge company, within this commonwealth, in which the said commonwealth held a moiety, or more of bona fide stock, was reduced to five, three of whom were to be elected by the stockholders in such turnpike and bridge companies, and two appointed by the auditor general: *And whereas*, The commonwealth hath sold her stock in the Greensburg and Pittsburg turnpike road company, to bona fide purchasers, who claim the rights and immunities of original subscribers; therefore,

Greensburg and Pittsburg turnpike road company, to elect managers. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the passage of this act, it shall be lawful for the stockholders of the Greensburg and Pittsburg turnpike road company, at the time and place heretofore fixed by law, to elect five managers, to manage the concerns of the said company, whose term of office shall continue one year from the first Monday of March, and until a new board of managers shall be duly elected and qualified.
