AN ACT

To repeal the act passed eighth of February, 1842, entitled "An Act supplementary to an act, entitled 'An Act relative to the organization of courts of justice,' passed the fourteenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the act, entitled "An Act supplementary to an act, entitled 'An Act relative to the organization of courts of justice,' passed the fourteenth day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four," and which supplementary act was passed on the eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, be and the same is hereby repealed. Former act repealed.

SECTION 2. All causes and proceedings now depending and undetermined in the supreme court for the Eastern district, removed or brought into the same from the county of Lancaster, shall be deemed to be depending before the said court in the Middle district, and shall be proceeded in by the said court in like manner as if they had been originally returned to the said court in the Middle district; and the prothonotary of the supreme court for the Middle district, shall collect and receive all fees which may have accrued in any cause or proceeding, which, by virtue of the repeal of the act aforesaid, shall be removed to the said district, and shall account for and pay the same when received, to the persons respectively entitled thereto. Supreme court, Middle district, causes from Lancaster county.

SECTION 3. The judges of the supreme court shall prescribe, by rule of court, certain days for the return of writs, hereafter to be issued from the said court, to the county of Lancaster, which shall be returnable to the supreme court for the Middle district, in conformity to the provisions of this act; and all writs heretofore issued and not yet returned, shall be returned at the next term of the said court for the Middle district, at such time as the said judges may direct. Returns to Middle district.
