AN ACT

Relative to wolves and panthers in the counties of Clearfield and Centre, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That hereafter the premium allowed for wolf and panther scalps, killed in the counties of Clearfield and Centre, to be paid by the said counties, shall be as follows: For a full grown wolf or panther, six dollars; and for a wolf or panther puppy, three dollars; and so much of the act of assembly of sixteenth of March, one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, as allows twelve dollars for a full grown wolf or panther, and five dollars for a wolf or panther puppy, be repealed, so far as the same relates to Clearfield county, and is not inconsistent with the provisions of this act.

SECTION 2. That the bounty in Clarion county, allowed on scalps of foxes, shall be seventy-five cents.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Northern mutual insurance company of Lancaster county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Samuel Keller, J. J. Keller, Daniel Keller, William H. Paul, Abraham Bear, Jacob Hibshman, Jacob Shirk, senior, B. Smith, and all other persons who may hereafter associate with them in the manner hereinafter prescribed, shall be, and they are hereby constituted and declared to be a body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title of the "Northern mutual insurance company of Lancaster county," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be
