

Centre county. years, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects the township of Potter, in the county of Centre.

Philadelphia, Passyunk town-
ship. SECTION 5. That it shall be the duty of each of the supervisors of the township of Passyunk, in the county of Philadelphia, elected in the spring of one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and those who may hereafter be elected, to enter into a bond in double the sum of the amount of the duplicate of taxes assessed in any one year, for township purposes, with at least one approved security, conditioned for the faithful collecting the same, and accounting for all moneys received by them and paying over all balances in their hands to their successors in office; the court of common pleas in said county shall approve of said bonds, and shall have the power to allow their said accounts and compel settlements thereof, at least once in every year; the supervisors elected in eighteen hundred and forty-four shall enter into the above named bond within thirty days after the passage of this act, and all supervisors hereafter elected shall give the required security at the term of the said court, immediately succeeding their said election.

Elections, Pottsville borough. SECTION 6. That the time for holding the borough elections in the borough of Pottsville, shall be on the days now fixed by law, and the polls shall be opened between the hours of eight and ten o'clock, in the morning, and close at seven o'clock in the evening; and it shall be the duty of the judges and inspectors elected at the March elections next preceding the borough elections, to officiate as the officers of the respective wards for which they shall have been so elected at the borough elections, except that the judges and inspectors elected for the Northwest ward, as aforesaid, shall officiate as the officers of borough elections held in and for the North ward, in said borough.

AN ACT

Providing that the treasurers of Lycoming and Schuylkill counties shall receive a fixed salary, and regulating fees in certain cases, and for other purposes.

Lycoming county. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the expiration of the term of office of the present incumbent, the treasurer of the county of Lycoming shall be entitled to, and receive in lieu of the compensation now allowed by law, a stated and fixed salary of three hundred dollars per annum, in addition to the fees and compensation now received by him for the collection and paying

over of moneys due to, and for the use of the commonwealth; and from and after the expiration of the period aforesaid, the fees and charges to be received by the said treasurer, as well as by the prothonotary of said county, in reference to advertising, selling and conveying lands sold for taxes, shall be as follows, viz: Advertising each tract, including printers' charges, twenty cents; selling each tract, or part thereof, as the case may be, ten cents; providing and signing each deed, fifty cents; acknowledging deeds, ten cents; prothonotary's fee entering acknowledgment of deeds, twenty-five cents; providing and filing bonds to secure surplus purchase money, ten cents: *Provided*, That so much of the twenty-fifth section of the act of the twenty-eighth March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, entitled "An Act establishing a fee bill," and so much of any act or acts of assembly of this commonwealth, as are inconsistent with the provisions herein contained, be and the same are hereby repealed, so far as relates to Lycoming county. Proviso.

SECTION 2. That the treasurer of the county of Schuylkill shall have and receive the sum of one per centum for all moneys received by him for the use of said county, and one-fourth of one per centum for all moneys paid out by him, as treasurer of said county, in full compensation for his services, except the legal fees allowed for the sale of unseated lands for taxes. Schuylkill county.

SECTION 3. That from and after the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, the treasurer of the county of Clinton shall be entitled to have and receive (in lieu of the compensation now allowed by law) a stated and fixed salary of three hundred dollars per annum, in addition to the compensation now received by them for the collection of moneys due to, and for the use of, the commonwealth; and from and after the expiration of the period aforesaid, the fees and charges to be received by the said treasurer, as well as by the prothonotary of said county, in reference to advertising, selling and conveying lands sold for taxes, shall be as follows, viz: Advertising each tract, including printers' charges, twenty cents; selling each tract, or a part thereof, as the case may be, ten cents; providing and signing each deed, fifty cents; acknowledging deed, ten cents; prothonotary's fee entering acknowledgment of deed, twenty-five cents; providing and filing bonds to secure surplus purchase money, ten cents: *Provided*, That so much of the twenty-fifth section of the act of the twenty-eighth of March, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, entitled "An Act establishing a fee bill," and so much of any act or acts of assembly of this commonwealth, as are inconsistent with the provisions herein contained, be and the same are hereby repealed. SECTION 4. That the ninth section of the act approved the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, entitled "A county further supplement to the act, entitled 'An Act for erecting the town of York into a borough,' passed twenty-fourth September, one thousand seven hundred and eighty-seven, and for other purposes," be and the same is hereby repealed.
