Entitled "An Act changing the name of East Strasburg township, in the county of Lancaster, to that of Paradise."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the name of East Strasburg township, in the county of Lancaster, shall be changed to Paradise; and it shall hereafter be known and acknowledged as Paradise township, in the county of Lancaster, to all intents and purposes, as though the name had not been changed.

To continue and extend an act, entitled "A further supplement to an act, entitled 'An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to make a lock navigation on the river Schuylkill.'"

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and singular the provisions of an act, entitled "A further supplement to an act, entitled 'An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to make a lock navigation on the river Schuylkill,'" be and the same are hereby continued and extended for a period of fifteen years, Time extended. to commence and be computed from the eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-five: *Provided, Proviso.* That this act shall not be so construed as in any way to effect the rights, interests and privileges, granted to the incorporated districts of the county of Philadelphia, by the act of eighteenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, entitled "An Act to authorize the commis-

sioners of the incorporated districts of the county of Philadelphia, to construct works for supplying said districts with water, from the river Schuylkill."

Repeal.

SECTION 2. That the last proviso of the first section of an act, entitled "An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to make a lock navigation on the river Schuylkill," passed the eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

For the relief of Catharine Shaw, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay Catharine Shaw, of Westmoreland county, forty dollars as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, and to John Sutherland, of Mercer county, Elizabeth Jeffries, of Gallia county, Ohio, and Mary Hutchinson, of Huntingdon county, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity for services in the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 2. *That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to* Philip Bausher, of Berks county, a soldier, Elizabeth Anderson, of Cumberland county and Christiana Reisher, of Franklin county, David Rallya, of Crawford county, soldier, and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.
