To establish the boundary lines between the counties of Mifflin, Juniata and Union.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That David Hough, of Mifflin county, J. W. Allen, of Juniata county, and Robert H. Hays, of Union county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to run and mark, or re-mark according to law, the boundary lines between the counties of Mifflin, Juniata and Union aforesaid, and file a draft of the same in the commissioners' office of the respective counties, and the said commissioners shall employ two chain carriers, and shall make out a just and true account of all the incidental expenses incurred in performance of their duty, and shall be paid equally by the counties of Mifflin, Juniata and Union, in the usual manner.

A N A C T

For the relief of Ann Huston, widow of a soldier of the Revolutionary war, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Ann Huston of Washington county, widow of a soldier of the Revolutionary war, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four. SECTION 2. The gratuity and annuity granted to Nicholas James, of York county, by an act, entitled "An Act for the relief of John A. York county. Smith and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars," passed the eleventh day of April, one thousand eight
