AN ACT

Laying a tax on dogs in the borough of Johnstown, in the county of Cambria.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the town council of the borough of Johnstown, in the county of Cambria, and they are hereby authorized to assess and collect, on each and every dog owned or kept by any citizen or inhabitant of said borough, a tax to any amount not exceeding one dollar for the first, two dollars for the second, and so on, in proportion to the number kept by each inhabitant or citizen of said borough, as they may deem expedient and proper, for the use of the said corporation of the borough of Johnstown aforesaid.

SECTION 2. That in all cases where taxes are assessed and paid on Philadelphia and dogs in the city and county of Philadelphia, and county of Allegheny, Allegheny. the said dogs shall be considered as personal property, and the owners thereof shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges in relation to the same as in other cases of personal property.

S. Clarkson, of the borough of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster, respectively, and appraise the damages sustained by each, in consequence of the Canal commissioners' duty.

AN ACT

To authorize the executors of the last will and testament of John Crossthwaite, late of Centre county, or their legal representatives, to pay over to Francis Dunlap, of Clearfield county, certain legacies.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the executors of the last will and testament of John Crossthwaite, late of Centre county, deceased, or their legal representatives, are hereby authorized and required to pay over to Francis Dunlap, of the county of Clearfield, the legacies bequeathed to John Dunlap and Daniel Dunlap, by said will, as soon as the said Francis Dunlap shall have given bond, with sufficient sureties, to the orphans' court of Clearfield county, to secure the same.

SECTION 2. The orphans' court of Clearfield county is hereby authorized and required to receive a bond, with security, to be by them approved of, from Francis Dunlap, conditioned that the above mentioned legacies, or such sum of money as he shall receive from the said executors, shall be faithfully paid over to the said John and Daniel Dunlap, or their legal representatives, whenever the same shall be called for.
