AN ACT

For the relief of Jacob Lohr and the Gettysburg and Petersburg turnpike company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to issue to Jacob Lohr, a certificate of indebtedness for such damages as may have been awarded to him, not exceeding the sum of six hundred and sixty-six dollars, in consequence of the construction of the Gettysburg railroad; the said certificate to bear interest at the rate of six per cent., to be counted from the twenty-seventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

SECTION 2. That the canal commissioners shall be authorized to examine the claim of the Gettysburg and Petersburg turnpike road company, and settle the same: *Provided*, The sum allowed shall not exceed one hundred and fifty-one dollars, and draw their warrant on the state treasurer for the amount that may be found to be due.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the acts relating to the holding of special courts in Fayette county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That any suit, cause or matter now pending, or hereafter to be brought or entered, in the court of common pleas of Fayette county, where the amount or matter in controversy exceeds one hundred dollars, and all actions of ejectment or trespass, where the title to real property may come in question, may, at the election of either plaintiff or defendant, Transfer of causes from court of common pleas to special court in Fayette county.
