A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act erecting the town of Warren, in the county of Warren, into a borough and township, and for other purposes."

Boundaries.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the borough lines of the borough and township of Warren, in the county of Warren, shall hereafter be as follows: Commencing at the north-east corner of reserved tract, number twenty; thence east to a point at low water mark, on the east bank of the Conewongo creek; thence down said Conewongo creek by the east bank thereof, at low water mark, to the mouth of the same, and its confluence with the Allegheny river; thence down said river to a point opposite the public way at the west end of the in-lots, in the said borough and township of Warren; thence northerly along the west side of said public way to the south line of reserved tract, number nineteen; thence by the south and south-east boundaries of said reserved tracts, numbers nineteen and twenty, by their various courses and distances, to the north-east corner of said reserved tract, number twenty, the place of beginning; and the corporate powers, rights and privileges of the said borough and township, shall hereafter be, and they are hereby extended over the limits included within the bounds aforesaid, as fully and effectually, as if the same had been originally included therein.

Repeal.

SECTION 2. That so much of the said act, entitled "An Act erecting the town of Warren, and township of Warren, in the county of Warren, into a borough, and for other purposes," as relates to the boundaries of the said borough of Warren, the same is hereby repealed.

Borough of Norristown, Montgomery county.

SECTION 3. That the court of quarter sessions of the county, named in the sixth section of the act, entitled "An Act declaring the streets, lanes and alleys, in the town of Bloomsburg, in Columbia county, public highways, and authorizing the election of an additional supervisor, and for other purposes," approved the eleventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, upon the petition of citizens of the borough named in said section, shall have authority to widen any street in said borough; and said court shall proceed therein, by views and reviews, in the manner provided for laying out public roads by the existing laws, and the expenses and damages shall be ascertained and paid by the county, as in cases of laying out public roads: *Provided,* That such petition shall be accompanied with a plot or draft of said street, showing distinctly the alterations desired by the petitioners, and the report of the viewers and reviewers shall also be accompanied with a plot or draft of said street, showing the alteration or additional width recommended or made in such report; and upon the confirmation of any such report, such street shall be opened and widened agreeably thereto, and kept in repair as other streets in said borough; and all proceedings of said court, heretofore commenced, touching the widening of any street in said borough, are hereby confirmed and declared to be as valid, to all intents and purposes, as if this section had been in full force and existence previous to the commencement of such proceedings:

Proviso.

And provided also, That no street shall be widened to more than fifty feet wide, and that this section shall not be construed to apply to the widening of any public alley in said borough.

AN ACT

Relative to the surveyor general's office.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, the surveyor general shall issue warrants for lands to the deputy surveyors, in the same manner, and subject to the same conditions, as are now in force in regard to the issuing of warrants by the secretary of the land office, the original to be filed in the office of the surveyor general, and a copy thereof directed to the deputy surveyor of the proper county in which the land may be situated; and all patents and other papers heretofore signed by the secretary of the land office, and countersigned by the deputy secretary of the land office, shall, after the said tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, be signed by the governor, and countersigned by the surveyor general.

Duties of governor and surveyor general.

SECTION 2. That from and after the tenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, the clerk hire in the surveyor general's office shall not exceed the sum of four thousand dollars per annum; and so much of the act, entitled "An Act to reduce the expenses of government," passed April seventeenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, as limits the clerk hire in said office to three thousand five hundred dollars, be and the same is hereby repealed.
