a certain note for fifty thousand dollars, dated June thirty, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, signed by certain private citizens, and discounted by said bank for the use of the Commonwealth, in the repair of the Huntingdon breach, in the Pennsylvania canal, and draw his warrant upon the state treasurer in favor of said bank for any amount which may be found due for principal and interest on said note from its maturity, until the time of the transfer by the state treasurer of fifty thousand dollars from the Girard bank to the said Harrisburg bank, for the purpose of stopping the accruing interest; and on final settlement in the manner herein stated, said note shall be surrendered to the drawers thereof: *Provided*, That the said sum of fifty thousand dollars, now on deposit in said bank, shall be applied to the payment of said note.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer and auditor general are hereby required to examine and audit the accounts and vouchers of the several persons entrusted with the receipts and disbursements of the money necessarily expended in repairing the breach on the Juniata division of the Pennsylvania canal, between Hollidaysburg and Huntingdon; and shall audit and settle the said accounts upon the same principle, and in the same manner as the accounts for repairs and construction of the canals are settled, and according to the mode prescribed by existing laws, as if the money had been originally drawn from the treasury in the usual manner.

AN ACT

To authorize George Schmucker and others, trustees, to sell and convey certain real estate.

Proviso.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That George Schmucker, Charles Eicholtz and John Hile, be and they are hereby constituted trustees, with authority to sell and convey, in fee simple, the old stone church and lot of ground connected therewith, situate in Williamsburg, Huntingdon county: *Provided*, That before any such sale, the consent of two-thirds of the male members of the Lutheran church of Williamsburg, shall be obtained: *And provided further*, That nothing hereinbefore contained shall authorize the said trustees to interfere with the grave yard connected with the said old

church, and that said trustees shall pay over the proceeds of said sale, agreeably to the direction, in writing, of such male members.

SECTION 2. That Jacob Sherk, trustee, named in the deed of trust Jacob Sherk, trust to him given by Peter Sherk and wife, for seventy-three perches of land for a meeting house, in said deed of trust mentioned, situate in and wife, to sell East Hanover township, Lebanon county, commonly known as Sherk's real estate. meeting house, be and he is hereby authorized and directed, for such consideration as he may deem sufficient, to grant, bargain, sell, and fully and amply convey unto Jacob Albert, Henry Neidig and George Baumgartner. and their successors forever, in trust, and for the use of those christians worshipping there, by and under the name of "Die Vereingte Bruder in Christo," or "The United Brethren in Christ," all that the said seventy-three perches of land, with the meeting house, buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging, to have and to hold the said seventy-three perches of land, with the meeting house, buildings and appurtenances thereunto belonging, unto the said Jacob Albert, Henry Neidig and George Baumgartner, trustees as aforesaid, and to their successors, to be chosen by the members of said denomination of christians worshipping there, according to their customs and general usages forever, excepting and reserving to those mentioned in said deed of trust, all the rights and privileges therein reserved unto them.
