

Resolved, That any person who may be constitutionally qualified to vote in any city or county of this commonwealth, but who may have been removed from one ward to another ward within such city, or from any borough or township in any such county, to any borough or township in such county, within ten days next preceding any general election held therein, shall be entitled to vote at such general election in the ward, borough or township from which such person may have so removed.

Resolved, That if any person in any county of this commonwealth shall receive, or have any chattels, goods, money, valuable security, or other property whatsoever, which shall have been stolen or otherwise feloniously taken in any state or territory of the United States of America, such person knowing the said property to have been stolen or otherwise feloniously taken, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and may be dealt with, indicted, tried and punished for such offence in such county of this commonwealth, where he shall so receive or have the said property, in the same manner as if it had been originally stolen in that or any other county of this commonwealth.

To authorize the employment of clerks to comparing committees.
