RESOLUTION

Relative to the claim of Samuel Davis.

SECTION 1. *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the canal commissioners are hereby authorized and directed to examine the claim of Samuel Davis of Cambria county, for receiving and distributing railroad iron on the Allegheny Portage railway, from the twenty-ninth December, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, till the fifteenth October, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three; and if a just claim is clearly proven to exist, and is unpaid, then to settle the same at a rate not exceeding fifteen cents per ton of said iron, and the same shall be paid out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
