AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of Cumberland and Perry counties to pay a certain amount of money to the supervisors of Mifflin and Jackson townships, in said counties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Commissioners of Cumberland county be and they are hereby authorized and required to pay to the supervisors of the roads of Mifflin township, (who shall be elected at the next township election,) the sum of four hundred dollars out of the county funds, to be applied by said supervisors to the construction of a road lately laid out from M'Corrick's mill, in said township, to the Perry county line, on the top of the mountain.

SECTION 2. That the commissioners of Perry county be and they are hereby required to pay to the supervisors of the roads of Jackson township, who shall be elected at the next township election, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars out of the county treasury, to be applied by said supervisors to the construction of a road lately laid out from M'Farland's tannery, in said township, to the Cumberland county line, on the top of the mountain.

SECTION 3. The aforesaid supervisors shall give to the commonwealth a bond with one or more sufficient sureties, to be approved of by the judges of the court of quarter sessions of their respective counties, for the faithful application of the aforesaid sums of money as directed by this act.
