To protect certain loanholders.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That no loan of money or contract heretofore made by any person or persons to or with the Philadelphia and Reading railroad company, shall be deemed or taken to be usurious, for or by reason of such company agreeing to pay a greater interest than at the rate of six per cent. per annum, or giving its bonds or other evidences of debt for a greater sum than the sum actually lent them; but such loans and contracts shall be deemed and taken to be lawful and valid.

A N A C T
