RESOLUTION

Explanatory of the act of assembly approved the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That nothing contained in the act approved the nineteenth day of February, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, entitled "An Act regulating election districts," shall be so construed as to allow the citizens of the borough of Manayunk, in the county of Philadelphia, to vote for judge and inspectors of elections at the township election for township officers, on the third Friday of March annually; and the judge and inspectors elected on the day aforesaid, shall hold all general, special, and township elections for township officers during the year for which they may elected. Relative to the improvement of the Allegheny river.

WHEREAS, It is the true policy of the national government to improve the harbors and national rivers of our country, and thus provide for its general defence, and unite more intimately the various states of our Union; therefore,

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That our senators and representatives in congress be requested to support measures for the improvement of the steamboat navigation of the Allegheny river, from Pittsburg, in Pennsylvania, to Hamilton village, in the state of New York.
