RESOLUTION

Relative to the claim of John S. King and Company.

Canal commis-
sioners to settle.

To draw war-
rant on state
treasurer.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to examine and settle the claim of John S. King and Company, for a balance due for four thousand seven hundred and forty-six barrels and eighty-three pounds of water lime delivered by them on the Erie extension of the Pennsylvania canal, under their contract with Hugh Keys, the superintendent, dated the fourth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, according to the terms of said contract, making such deduction for deficiency in the quality of the lime at the time of its delivery, if any, as said canal commissioners may think would be just and proper, and allowing interest on the residue from the passage of the resolutions relative to the payment of interest to domestic creditors, approved April seventh, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and to draw their warrant on the state treasurer in favor of said John S. King and Company, for the amount so found to be due, which shall be paid out of any moneys in the treasury.
