To provide for the payment of the interest on the funded debt of this commonwealth, falling due within the current financial year.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the sum of one million nine hundred and eleven thousand eight hundred and forty-eight dollars and forty-eight cents, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the payment of the interest on the funded debt of this commonwealth, which will fall due on the first day of February, and on the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six: *Provided, That the payments hereby authorized shall be made in such funds as may be in the treasury, and such portion of said funds as may not be par in the city of Philadelphia, shall be paid out in proportion to the several amounts due for interest provided for by this act.* Appropriated. Proviso.

A N A C T

Supplemental to an act to provide for the erection of a house for the employment and support of the poor of the county of Somerset, and for other purposes, passed fifteenth April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the time at which the commissioners appointed by the first section of the act of the fifteenth April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, are to determine and purchase real estate for a poor house in the county of Somerset, be and the same is hereby extended until the first day of October next; and the said commissioners are hereby *Time to purchase real estate ex-* tended.

A N A C T

To authorize Charles S. Bradford, Trustee of Mary M. Brackenridge, of the county of Allegheny, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Charles S. Bradford, of the city of Pittsburg, trustee for the separate use of Mary M. Brackenridge, wife of Alexander Brackenridge, of Allegheny county, and for the children of said Alexander Brackenridge and Mary, is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, with the consent of said Mary, a certain piece of ground situate on the rear of ground of William A. V. Magan and wife, forty feet in breadth, by thirty feet in depth, being an interior part of lot number two hundred and twenty, in the city of Pittsburg; and further, to invest the proceeds of such sale in the reduction or extinguishment of any existing mortgages or incumbrances against said trust estate, or in the purchase of such other estate or securities, as in either case may be approved of by the court of common pleas of said county, for the same uses, benefits and trusts, as heretofore appointed.

SECTION 2. That the said trustee be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey, with the consent of said Mary, a certain house and lot of ground, containing about one acre and an half, situate in Pitt township, Allegheny county, (the same which said trustee, heretofore, purchased with the money of said trust estate from John Heron;) and further, to invest the proceeds of such sale in like manner, and for the like purposes as above directed: *Provided, however,* That before executing the powers hereby granted, the said Charles S. Bradford shall give sufficient security, to be approved of by the said court, for the faithful execution of the same.
