A SUPPLEMENT

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the passage of this act, the fees to be received by the Fees of constables, for removing paupers to the poor house in the county of bles fixed. Cumberland, shall be five cents per mile, circular.

AN ACT

For the relief of the estate of Joseph Dugan, deceased.

WHEREAS, Joseph Dugan, late of the city of Philadelphia, by his last will, bearing date the fifteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, proved and remaining in the office of register of wills in and for the city and county of Philadelphia; did give and devise all his real and personal estate, not specifically devised and be- Preamble. queathed to his trustees therein named, Clement C. Biddle, Edward C. Dale, Ann Dugan, his sister, who died in the testator's lifetime, and Augustus James Pleasonton, and the survivors and survivor of them, and the heirs, executors and administrators of the survivor, upon certain trusts; and did authorize and empower the said trustees, and the survivors and the survivor of them, and their successors in the trust, to sell and dispose of any of his unimproved lots of ground, upon ground rents so reserved, as to be redeemable at the time when his estate, according to the directions in the said will, is to be divided; which time
