AN ACT

To reduce the expenses of Northampton county.

Pay of Commis-
sioners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, the present commissioners of Northampton county, and those that may be hereafter elected or appointed, shall respectively receive out of the county treasury the sum of one dollar and fifty cents each, for every day that they shall respectively attend to their duties as commissioner: Provided however, That the pay of any one of the said commissioners shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and thirty dollars per annum.*

AN ACT

To continue the law graduating lands on which purchase money is due the commonwealth.

Act of April
1835 extended.

Time for patent-
ing lots in Erie,
&c. extended.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the provisions of the "Act to graduate lands on which purchase money is due and unpaid the commonwealth," passed the tenth day of April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and thirty-five, are hereby continued in force until the tenth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-nine.*

SECTION 2. *That the time for patenting the in-lots and out-lots of the towns of Erie, Waterford, Beaver, Franklin and Warren, authorized to be appraised by the fifth section of "An Act empowering the burgess and town council of the borough of Erie to borrow money, and supply said borough with water," passed thirteenth day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, is hereby extended until the tenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.*

SECTION 3. That the provisions of the act passed the second day of April, eighteen hundred and eleven, respecting the issuing a patent for undrawn lot number one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven, in the tenth donation district, shall not be so construed as to prevent a patent issuing for said undrawn lot, as in other cases of undrawn lots, under the third section of the act passed the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five. Undrawn lot 1987 in 10th donation district.

AN ACT

Relating to the recovery of debts due associations.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall not be lawful for any person who may have become indebted, or liable to pay any sum of money to any unincorporated association, to avail themselves, by way of defence to any action or judgment now brought or had, or which may hereafter be brought or had therefor, of the provisions of the act of nineteenth March, one thousand eight hundred and ten, entitled “An Act supplementary to an act relating to the association of individuals for the purpose of banking.”
