AN ACT

To divide the Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh wards in the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, into election precincts.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the Fifth ward in the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia, shall be divided into two election precincts, as follows, to wit: From the north side of Green street to the south side of Poplar street, and from the river Delaware to the east side of New Market street, shall be the first precinct; and from the north side of Green street to the south side of Poplar street, and from the west side of New Market street to the east side of Third street, shall be the second precinct; and the qualified electors of the said first and second precincts, shall hold their ward elections at separate windows of the house now occupied by Jacob Wolf, at the north-east corner of New Market and Coates streets, in said ward.

Northern Liberties, 5th ward divided into two precincts.

SECTION 2. The Sixth ward in the said district, shall be divided into two election precincts, as follows, to wit: From the north side of Green street to the south side of Brown street, and from the west side of Third street to the east side of Sixth street, shall be the first precinct; and from the north side of Brown street to the south side of Poplar street, and from the west side of Third street to the east side of Sixth street, shall be the second precinct; and the qualified electors of the said first and second precincts, shall hold their ward elections at separate windows of the house now occupied by Frederick Blankenheim, at the north-east corner of Coates and Fourth streets, in said ward.

Sixth ward divided into two precincts.

SECTION 3. The seventh ward in the said district, shall be divided into two election precincts, as follows, to wit: From the north side of Poplar street to the Cohocksink creek, and from the Cohocksink creek to the east side of Third street, shall be the first precinct; and from the north side of Poplar street to the Cohocksink creek, and from the west side of Third street to the east side of Sixth street, shall be the second precinct; and the qualified electors of the said first and second precincts, shall hold their ward elections at separate windows of the house now occupied by Henry Hesselpoth, at the north-east corner of Third and Poplar streets, in the said ward.

Seventh ward divided into two precincts.

SECTION 4. The qualified electors of each or any of the precincts in the said wards, may change the place of holding their respective elections to any other place within such precinct, in the manner prescribed by existing laws for changing the place of holding elections in the county of Philadelphia.

Electors may change places of holding elections in precincts.

SECTION 5. The present judges and inspectors of the said wards respectively, shall appoint the additional officers of the election in their respective precincts for the ensuing March election; and the qualified voters shall then, and at all future elections, elect judges and inspectors for their precincts, and appoint clerks in the manner now prescribed by

law for the conducting of the general and special elections in this commonwealth; and the commissioners of the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, shall make the necessary arrangements for the said additional precincts, for holding their general election at the commissioners' hall.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia, to furnish the additional judges and inspectors to be appointed under this act, with ballot boxes, blanks, forms and lists of taxables, as are by law now furnished to judges and inspectors of elections within the said district, and to pay the said additional judges, inspectors and clerks, the same compensation as other like officers of elections; Duties of county commissioners.

SECTION 7. So much of any law as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An Act to define the boundaries of East Brunswick school district, Schuylkill county," passed tenth of March, eighteen hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the territory contained within the following boundaries, be and is hereby annexed to the school district of East Brunswick, in the county of Schuylkill, beginning at a point where the Little Schuylkill railroad crosses the Little Schuylkill river, mentioned in said act of tenth March, eighteen hundred and forty-five; thence along the said river Schuylkill to land owned by Peter and Nicholas Jones, known as the Rumble tract; thence along said line on the east side of the river Schuylkill, including the whole of said Rumble tract, to the said river Schuylkill; thence along said river to East Brunswick township line; thence along said line to where the line running due north from J. Yost's mill dam, as mentioned in said act, intersects said township line; which said school district, as enlarged by the foregoing boundaries, shall hereafter be a part of said East Brunswick school district; and the said district shall be subject to all the provisions,
