

law for the conducting of the general and special elections in this commonwealth; and the commissioners of the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, shall make the necessary arrangements for the said additional precincts, for holding their general election at the commissioners' hall.

SECTION 6. It shall be the duty of the commissioners of the county of Philadelphia, to furnish the additional judges and inspectors to be appointed under this act, with ballot boxes, blanks, forms and lists of taxables, as are by law now furnished to judges and inspectors of elections within the said district, and to pay the said additional judges, inspectors and clerks, the same compensation as other like officers of elections; Duties of county commissioners.

SECTION 7. So much of any law as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, is hereby repealed. Repeal.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An Act to define the boundaries of East Brunswick school district, Schuylkill county," passed tenth of March, eighteen hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the territory contained within the following boundaries, be and is hereby annexed to the school district of East Brunswick, in the county of Schuylkill, beginning at a point where the Little Schuylkill railroad crosses the Little Schuylkill river, mentioned in said act of tenth March, eighteen hundred and forty-five; thence along the said river Schuylkill to land owned by Peter and Nicholas Jones, known as the Rumble tract; thence along said line on the east side of the river Schuylkill, including the whole of said Rumble tract, to the said river Schuylkill; thence along said river to East Brunswick township line; thence along said line to where the line running due north from J. Yost's mill dam, as mentioned in said act, intersects said township line; which said school district, as enlarged by the foregoing boundaries, shall hereafter be a part of said East Brunswick school district; and the said district shall be subject to all the provisions,

AN ACT

Authorizing the burgess and town council of the boroughs of Johnstown and Blairsville, in the counties of Cambria and Indiana, to provide lock-up houses.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the burgess and town council of the borough of Johnstown, in the county of Cambria, and the burgess and town council of the borough of Blairsville, in the county of Indiana, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to furnish materials, and build or otherwise provide and support, in or near to said boroughs, at the expense of said boroughs, suitable houses for the security and temporary detention of persons committed by justices of the peace of the said boroughs and vicinity; and by the burgess of said boroughs, or member of the town council acting in his place, for any violations of the laws of this commonwealth, or of the ordinances of said boroughs, for which such person or persons could lawfully be committed to the common prison of said county, there to remain, and be kept, until such offender or offenders can be removed to the common jail of the proper county, if committed for an indictable offence, or can be discharged according to law: *Provided,* That no person shall be confined in said house, at any one time, for a longer period than twenty-four hours, except such person be charged with an indictable offence, and it be necessary to detain him for examination.

SECTION 2. That the expenses of committing and keeping any person or persons in said house, on a charge of any indictable offence, shall be paid by the said counties of Cambria and Indiana, on the presentation of proper accounts of the same, to the commissioners of said counties.
