

gence to restore said water by repairs or otherwise, as the case may be, and that during the stoppage of such water, no pay shall be demanded or allowed; but those families or persons thus deprived of the use of said water, shall have and be entitled to a reasonable deduction from the price agreed upon to be paid for the use of the water aforesaid.

AN ACT

For the relief of Ann U. Weaver, widow of Thomas Weaver, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the attorney general of this commonwealth, be and he is hereby authorized to assign and transfer to Ann U. Weaver, widow of Thomas Weaver, the claim of the commonwealth on the estate of the said Thomas Weaver, deceased, who was one of the sureties of Frederick Fritz, formerly collector of tolls on the Columbia road, at Philadelphia: *Provided,* That the said Ann U. Weaver shall pay to the said attorney general, for the use of the commonwealth, the sum of fourteen thousand dollars for the same, in state bonds, or cash, on the execution of the said assignment: *Provided,* That the proceedings to be had, under this act, shall be had and completed before the first Monday of April next.
