A N A C T

To confirm parts of the plan of the survey and regulations of the Kensington district of the Northern Liberties, in the county of Philadelphia.

Location of
Beach street con-
firmed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That a certain street, named Beach street, lying between the river Delaware and Queen street, or the Point road, and extending from the north-eastern boundary of the said district to Vienna street, formerly called Bishop street, as is laid down upon the revised plan of the sixth division, and approved by the said commissioners the sixth day of January, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, a copy whereof is now in the office of the clerk of quarter sessions for inspection, be and is hereby declared to be and remain, as so laid down, forever unalterable.

Location of Co-
lumbia street con-
firmed.

SECTION 2. That a certain street, in the western section of the said district, named Columbia street, as laid down upon the supplement to the plan of the third and fourth division of said survey and regulation, at the distance of five hundred feet from Cherry street, fifty feet in width, the south line of which is in exact position with that which was the south line of the Columbia avenue, be and is hereby declared to remain, as so laid down, forever unalterable.

Bank street va-
cated.

SECTION 3. That so much of a certain road or street, now open and used as a highway, called Bank street, as lies within the district, be and is hereby vacated; also so much of a street, called Bank street, as was laid down upon the plan of the sixth division of the said survey and regulation, extending from the north-eastern boundary line to Wood street, and confirmed by the court of quarter sessions, be and is hereby vacated.

Repeal.

SECTION 4. That so much of any former act or acts, as is by this act altered or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.
