A SUPPLEMENT

To the act incorporating the York county savings institution, passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the said corporation shall be authorized to invest its funds in public stocks of this state, or of the United States, or real securities, or in discount of notes on personal securities: *Provided,* That the rate of discount at which loans may be made by the said institution, shall not exceed one-half per centum for thirty days.

AN ACT

Authorizing the canal commissioners to remove the barn of Samuel Parke and brothers, to prevent its destruction by fire from locomotives.

Canal commis-
sioners to remove
certain buildings.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to examine the situation and condition of the barn of Samuel Parke and brothers, situate at Parkesburg, Chester county, said barn being alleged to be so near the Philadelphia and Columbia railroad, as to render it almost impossible to escape conflagration from the sparks emitted by the locomotives in use upon said road; and that should the same take fire, the workshops of the state at that place, would be in great danger of being consumed; and if in their opinion there is danger of the said barn being destroyed, or liable to injury by fire from the locomotives running upon said railroad, and they shall deem it expedient for the interest of the commonwealth, they shall cause the said barn to be removed to such a situation more remote from the said railroad, as will secure it from the danger of being burned by locomotives, or pay the proprietors thereof, such sum or sums as in their judgment will be adequate compensation

to them for removing, rebuilding, or securing said barn, or adopt such measures as in their opinion, will promote the interest of the commonwealth and protect the property of the individuals; the money that may be requisite for carrying the provisions of this act into force and effect, shall be paid out of the damage fund: *Provided*, The said barn was erected prior to the location of the said Philadelphia and Columbia railroad.

AN ACT

To authorize William Gans, executor of David Rumble, late of Fayette county, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That upon the petition of William Gans, executor of the last will and testament of David Rumble, late of Springhill township, Fayette county, deceased, and the legatees named in said last will and testament who are of age, and the guardian of two who are minors, the orphans' court of said county are hereby authorized to grant an order to the said executor to sell at public sale, and execute a good and clear title to the purchaser or purchasers in fee simple therefor, all that tract or piece of land situate on the waters of George's creek, in the township and county aforesaid, of which David Rumble died seized: *Provided*, That before such sale shall be made, the said executor shall give a bond to the commonwealth, for the use of the persons interested, with such sureties, and in such penalty, as the said court shall approve, conditioned for the faithful execution of the authority hereby given, and the distribution of the proceeds arising from said sale to and among the heirs, in manner and as directed by said will: *And provided also*, That such sale shall not be carried into effect until the same shall be approved by the said court.
