Board of directors.

SECTION 12. The seven persons first named in the first section of this act, shall constitute the board of directors of said institution, until the first Saturday in October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, or until others are elected in their stead.

When policy may issue.

SECTION 13. No policy shall be issued by the company until application be made for insurance to the amount of forty-five thousand dollars.

Reservation.

SECTION 14. This act shall take effect immediately after its passage; but the legislature of this commonwealth may at any time alter, modify, or annul its provisions, in such manner, however, as to do no injustice to the corporators.

AN ACT

Regulating election districts.

Bradford co.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified voters of the township of Springhill, in Bradford county, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of D. D. Black, in said township.

Bedford co.

SECTION 2. That the qualified voters of the township of Licking Creek, in the county of Bedford, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public school house number two, in said township.

Indiana co.

SECTION 3. That all that part of Centre township, in the county of Indiana, which lies north-east of the state road from Indiana to Armagh, and south-east of Yellow creek, be and the same is hereby annexed to the township of Brush Valley, in said county of Indiana; and the qualified voters of that portion of Centre township, thus annexed to Brush Valley township, shall hereafter elect with the voters of Brush Valley township, in the county of Indiana.

SECTION 4. That all that portion of Centre township, in the county of Indiana, that lies east of White township, and between the townships of Green and Yellow Creek, in said county of Indiana, be and the same

is hereby annexed to the township of Green, in the county of Indiana, and the voters of that portion of Centre township, thus annexed to the township of Green, shall hereafter elect with the voters of said township of Green, in the county of Indiana.

SECTION 5. That the qualified voters of Washington township, in the Indiana co. county of Indiana, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by Job M'Creigh, in the township of Washington, in the said county of Indiana.

SECTION 6. That the qualified voters of Monroe township, in the Bedford co. county of Bedford, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Solomon Wimer, in the township of Monroe, in the said county of Bedford.

SECTION 7. That the qualified voters of Centre county, shall here- Township elec- after hold their township elections on the third Friday in February. tions in Centre county.

SECTION 8. That the forty-sixth section of the act, entitled "An Act regulating election districts," passed the fourteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-five, be and the same is hereby repealed; Westmoreland co. and the limits of the township of Hempfield, in the county of Westmoreland, are hereby declared to be restored and remain as if said act had not passed; and the qualified voters of the said township of Hempfield, shall hereafter, at a proper time and place of choosing supervisors Supervisors. of roads, elect three supervisors of the public roads in the said township, one of whom shall reside in that portion of the said township which lies south of Big Sewickly creek, and said additional supervisor shall be entitled to the same authority and compensation, and be subject to the same regulations and penalties as the other supervisors of roads in said township.

SECTION 9. That the qualified voters of Washington township, in the Clarion co. county of Clarion, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public school house number four, in said township.

SECTION 10. That the qualified voters of Richland township, in the Clarion co. county of Clarion, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Daniel Knight, in said township.

SECTION 11. That the qualified voters of Bern township, in the Berks co. county of Berks, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Jacob Kline, esquire, in said township.

SECTION 12. That the qualified voters of Green township, in the Pike co. county of Pike, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Jeremiah Bennet, in said township.

SECTION 13. That the qualified voters of Hopewell township, in the Bedford co. county of Bedford, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of John Dasher, in said township.

SECTION 14. That the qualified voters of South Hanover township, Dauphin co. in the county of Dauphin, shall hereafter hold their general election at the public house of George Hocker, in said township.

SECTION 15. That the qualified electors of the borough of West Philadelphia co. Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia, shall on the third Friday in March, at the time and place of holding constables' elections, elect three citizens in addition to the number now required by law, to serve as school directors, and the said directors so elected, shall divide themselves by lot, into three classes, one-third to serve one year; one-third, two years; and the remaining one-third, three years; and annually thereafter, the qualified electors shall elect two citizens to serve as school directors for the term of three years.

SECTION 16. That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified Philadelphia. electors of the Second ward, Moyamensing, in the county of Philadel-

phia, shall hold their ward elections at the house now occupied by Henry M'Menamon, in Eighth street, in the said ward.

Westmoreland co. SECTION 17. Hereafter, all that portion of the township of Sewickly, in the county of Westmoreland, which lies eastward of Hoke's run, shall be attached to and constitute a part of the township of Hempfield, in said county, and the said stream called Hoke's run, shall, so far as the township line is hereby altered, hereafter be the boundary line between the said townships of Hempfield and Sewickly: *Provided*, That all taxes heretofore assessed in the said portion of Sewickly township, hereby annexed to Hempfield township, shall be collected as if this act had not passed.

Westmoreland co. SECTION 18. The qualified voters of the Adamsburgh election district, in the county of Westmoreland, shall hereafter hold their spring elections for judge and inspectors of elections of said district, and also for township officers of the township of Hempfield, at the house designated by law for holding the general elections in said district; and the said spring elections in the said district, shall be held and conducted by the proper judge and inspectors of elections of said district, subject to the same restrictions and provisions as in other cases; and the judge of said election district, shall make return of said spring elections to the proper court, in the same manner as is provided for the return of other elections of township officers.

Bedford co. SECTION 19. That the qualified electors of the township of Harrison, Bedford county, be directed to hold their general and township elections at the house of George W. Powel, in said township.

Bedford co. SECTION 20. That the qualified electors of East Providence township, Bedford county, be directed to hold their general and township elections at the house of Alexander B. Tates, in said township.

Bedford co. SECTION 21. That the qualified electors of St. Clair township, Bedford county, be directed to hold their general and township elections at the school house in the town of St. Clairsville, in said township.

Bedford co. SECTION 22. That the new township lately struck from the old township of Hopewell, in the county of Bedford, be called Liberty; and the qualified electors of said new township of Liberty, Bedford county, shall hold their general and township elections hereafter at the house of Lewis Keith, esquire, in said township.

Philadelphia co. SECTION 23. That so much of the Fourth ward, Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, lying south of the centre of Washington street, in said township, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate ward, to be called the Fifth ward, Moyamensing; and the qualified voters of the said Fifth ward, shall hold their ward elections at the public school house in the said ward; and the election in the Fourth and Fifth wards, on the third Friday in March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, shall be conducted by the following officers, to wit: for the Fourth ward, judge, George Lentz; inspectors, Charles L. Pascal and George Whartenby; for the Fifth ward, judge, Abraham Dehart; inspectors, David Farrall and John Houghtman, who shall have all the powers, and perform all the duties, and be subject to all regulations that are by law prescribed for inspectors and judges of elections; and it shall be the duty of the constable of the said Fourth ward, to perform the duties required by law of the constables of the several wards and townships, in relation to ward elections, so far as relates to the election on the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, in the said Fifth ward.

Philadelphia. SECTION 24. It shall hereafter be lawful for the qualified voters of the said Fifth ward, on the third Friday in March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, and on the third Friday in March in every year

thereafter, in the manner prescribed by law, to elect one assessor; and when the other wards in the said township shall be required by existing laws so to do, two assistant assessors, one constable, one judge, and two inspectors of elections; and on the third Friday in March, eighteen hundred and forty-six, it shall be lawful for the qualified voters of the Fourth ward, at the time and place of electing assessor and other ward officers, to elect for said Fourth ward one of the duly qualified citizens thereof to serve as alderman: *Provided*, That the present alderman of the Fourth ward, shall act as alderman of the Fifth ward, until the expiration of his commission, when it shall be lawful for the qualified voters of the said Fifth ward, at the time and place of electing ward officers, to elect an alderman of the said ward.

SECTION 25. That the qualified electors of the new township of Mercer co. Wilmington, in the county of Mercer, shall hold their general and township elections at the school house in the village of New Wilmington, in said township; and that Samuel Phillips is hereby appointed judge of the election to be held on the third Friday in March next, and that George W. Wier and William M. Thompson, are hereby appointed inspectors of said election.

SECTION 26. That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified electors of the Third ward, Southwark, in the county of Philadelphia co. Philadelphia, shall hold their ward elections at the public house now occupied by John H. Gore, south-east corner of Fourth street and Washington market place, in the said ward.

SECTION 27. That the township of Fell, in the county of Luzerne, Luzerne co. is hereby erected into a separate election district; and that the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the house of A. W. Tickner, in said township.

SECTION 28. That the qualified voters of the borough of South Easton, in the county of Northampton, shall hereafter hold their general and borough elections at the town hall, in the said borough of South Easton.

SECTION 29. That the qualified voters of the township of Carroll, Cambria co. in the county of Cambria, shall hereafter hold their general election at the cross road leading to Ebensburg and Loretto, to the new school house, number three, in said township.

SECTION 30. That the qualified voters of the township of Spring Creek, in the county of Warren, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school house near the mouth of Spring Creek, in said township.

SECTION 31. That the qualified voters of the township of Middle Smithfield, in the county of Monroe, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Adam Moser, in said township.

SECTION 32. That the qualified voters of the townships of Monroe and Toby, in the county of Clarion, residing in the following named lines, shall hereafter form a new election district, the line commencing at Canoe ripple, on the Clarion river, where the road leading to Miller's mill crosses said river; thence by said road to where it crosses Licking creek; thence by said creek to the Monroe township line; thence along the Monroe township line to where it crosses Gutter's run; thence by said run to its mouth, where it empties into Piney creek; thence by Piney creek to the bridge at Davis's saw-mill; thence a straight line to Clarion river, so as to include Edward Corbell's farm; thence by the Clarion river to the place of beginning: the place of holding the general and township elections shall be at the eight square school house, in said Toby township, and that Andrew M'Gee, shall

be judge, and John Klingensmith and James M'Naughton be inspectors, to hold said election.

Jefferson co. SECTION 33. That the qualified voters of Winslow township, in Jefferson county, shall hold their township election on the first Monday of April next, and thereafter on the fourth Monday of February; and said general and township elections are to be held at the house of Woodward Reynolds, in said township; and Woodward Reynolds shall be judge, and Joshua Rea and Felton Reynolds be inspectors; and Thomas Reynolds is hereby appointed and empowered to advertise and hold the township election.

Beaver co. SECTION 34. That from and after the passage of this act, the townships of Marion, Perry, Wayne and North Sewickly, in the county of Beaver, shall, according to their boundaries established by the court of quarter sessions of Beaver county, each form a separate and distinct election district, and independent township.

Beaver co. elect justices. SECTION 35. That the citizens of each of the said townships, separately, shall have full power and authority to elect at the times, and in the manner prescribed by law, justices of the peace, and all township officers incident to, and necessary in a distinct and independent township.

Beaver co. SECTION 36. That the citizens of Marion township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of George Hartzel, jr., in said township. The citizens of Perry township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Robert White, in said township. The citizens of Wayne township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of John Bird, in said township. The citizens of North Sewickly township shall hold their general and township elections at the house formerly occupied by John Miller, on lands of Benjamin Chew, in said township.

Warren co. SECTION 37. That the qualified voters of the township of Spring Creek, in the county of Warren, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school-house, near the mouth of Spring creek, in said township.

Cumberland co. SECTION 38. That the qualified voters of that part of Allen township, Cumberland county, known as Lisburn district, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public house now occupied by John G. Heck, in Lisburn.

York co. SECTION 39. That the qualified voters of Washington township, York county, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by Jacob Gochenour, in said township.

Mercer co. SECTION 40. That the qualified voters of the township of Pymatuning, in the county of Mercer, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the school house in the village of Clarksville, in said township.

Mercer co. SECTION 41. That the qualified voters of that part of Lackawannock township, in the county of Mercer, living east of the Little Neshannock creek, shall hereafter hold the general election at the court house, in the borough of Mercer.

Cumberland co. SECTION 42. That the township of West Pennsborough, in the county of Cumberland, be and the same is hereby divided into two separate and distinct townships, for all purposes. The eastern township, to be called West Pennsborough township, and the western township, to be called Big Spring township. The division lines between said townships, to be the same as those designated by viewers appointed by the court of quarter sessions of Cumberland county in April last, to divide said township, who made report to said court in August last; which report,

with a plot or draft of the townships proposed to be erected, is filed in the office of the clerk of said court.

SECTION 43. That the qualified voters of Big Spring township, in Cumberland co. the county of Cumberland, shall hold their township elections at Laughlin's school house, in said township: *Provided*, That it shall be lawful for the electors of said township to change the place of holding the township elections, in the mode directed by law.

SECTION 44. That any money unexpended, which has been received Cumberland co. by the school directors of West Pennsborough township, in the said county of Cumberland, or which has been assessed, and shall hereafter be collected from the citizens of said township, which is by this act, divided into two separate townships, shall be divided between said townships, in proportion to the school tax assessed upon the citizens of said respective townships, at the last assessment for school purposes; funds. and the school directors of Big Spring township, or their treasurer, shall receive their proportion of such unexpended moneys.

SECTION 45. The several township officers heretofore elected, shall Cumberland co. continue to discharge the duties of their offices in the township in which they shall reside, during the time for which they may have been elected; and any vacancy that may occur, in consequence of the division as hereinbefore directed, shall be supplied, according to the provisions of the act of assembly regulating such elections. Notice of the first township elections in each of the aforesaid townships, shall be given by the present constable of West Pennsborough township, in the manner directed by existing laws, in reference to township elections. Township officers

SECTION 46. That the qualified voters of that part of the township Lancaster co. of East Donegal, in the county of Lancaster, included within the bounds of the tenth election district of said county, shall vote for township officers at the public school house in the village of Maytown, in said township; and that the qualified voters of that part of East Donegal township, in the said county of Lancaster, included within the bounds of the seventeenth election district of said county, shall vote for township officers, at the place of holding such election, in the borough of Marietta. etta; and the judges of said election shall meet at the house now occupied by Jacob Gilman, in the village of Maytown, on the Monday following said election, and cast up the votes given for the several officers now elected conjointly, according to law, by the township of East Donegal and borough of Marietta, and make a return of the same, Return judges. as now required by the laws regulating such elections.

SECTION 47. That from and after the passage of this act, the township of North Annville, in the county of Lebanon, shall be a separate Lebanon co. election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general and township elections at the public house now occupied by Henry Sergeant; and John Shirk, jr., is hereby appointed judge; and James Elliott and William Carmony, inspectors, to hold and conduct the township election, for the said township of North Annville, on the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, for the election of township officers, and for the election of two inspectors and one judge of elections, under and subject to the acts of assembly regulating such elections; and the officers heretofore elected in the township of Annville, who now reside within the bounds of said North Annville township, shall continue to discharge the duties of their several offices, during the time for which they have been elected; and any vacancy that may have occurred in said North Annville township, in consequence of the division of said township of Annville, shall be supplied according to the provisions of the acts of assembly regulating such elections. Centerville borough, school district.

Elect directors.

SECTION 48. That the borough of Centerville, in the county of Butler, is hereby erected and created into a new and separate common school district, and as such shall be entitled to all the offices, rights, powers and privileges allowed by law to other common school districts, and the elections thereof shall be held at the same time and place, with the borough elections of said borough; and the electors of said district shall, at their next election, elect six school directors thereof, two to serve one year; two to serve two years, and two to serve three years; said election to be conducted by the same officers who conduct said borough elections, and the successors of said directors shall be elected in the manner directed by law as to other school districts.

Slippery Rock township.

Arrears of school tax to be divided.

SECTION 49. That all arrears of school taxes heretofore assessed in the school district, then composed of the township of Slippery Rock, including said borough, shall be collected as if this act had not been passed, and all of such arrears as were assessed before the first day of September last, shall be applied as heretofore, including said borough; but the arrears of such taxes as have been assessed since said first day of September, on persons and property within the territory of said borough, shall be paid over and applied exclusively to said new school district; and so much of such arrears as were assessed since said first day of September, within the residue of the original district, shall be for the exclusive use of said residue of the original district, which is hereby declared to be a school district separate from said borough.

Elect constable.

SECTION 50. That the electors of said borough, shall, in addition to the officers now authorized by law, also elect annually, one person to serve as constable of said borough, who shall be sworn in and qualified in court as other constables, and shall perform all the duties, and be subject to all the provisions of law relating to other constables.

Elect borough auditors.

SECTION 51. That it shall be lawful for the electors of said borough, at their next annual election, to elect three persons as auditors, who shall annually audit all public accounts of said borough, one of whom shall be elected for one year; one for two years, and one for three years; and annually thereafter, said electors shall elect one person for three years, to fill the place of the auditor whose term may be about to expire; and all of said auditors shall be sworn or affirmed to perform the duties of their office with honesty, impartiality and fidelity.

York co.

SECTION 52. That the elections in the township of Hellam, in the county of York, shall hereafter be held at Rudy's and Stoner's school house, on the York and Susquehanna turnpike road, in said township.

Beaver co.

SECTION 53. That the borough of Phillipsburg, in the county of Beaver, be and is hereby declared a separate election district, and the qualified electors of said borough are hereby authorized to elect annually, one assessor and one constable.

SECTION 54. That the place of holding the general and special elections in said borough, shall be at the house now occupied by George Frank.

Beaver.

SECTION 55. That that part of Phillipsburg election district, not embraced in the charter of incorporation obtained from the court of quarter sessions of Beaver county, September, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, is hereby attached to, and shall form part of Moon township.

Clinton.

SECTION 56. That from and after the passage of this act, the general and township elections in the township of Lamar, in the county of Clinton, shall be held at the house of John Leidy, in the village of Salona.

SECTION 57. That hereafter the general and township elections in the Clearfield township of Goshen, in the county of Clearfield, shall be held at the public school house in said township.

SECTION 58. The qualified electors of Mount Pleasant township, in Westmoreland, the county of Westmoreland, shall hereafter hold their township election at the stone school house on the farm of John Newal, in said township.

SECTION 59. That the qualified electors of the township of Clay, in Huntingdon, the county of Huntingdon, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Joshua Shore, at the Three Springs, in said township, and that Jacob Baker is hereby appointed judge, and George Hudson and William Cornelius, inspectors, to hold and conduct the next ensuing township election.

SECTION 60. That the qualified electors of the township of Beaver, Columbia, in the county of Columbia, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of Adam Michael, in said township, and that Henry Shell, is hereby appointed judge, and David Davis and David Johnson, inspectors, to hold and conduct the next ensuing township election in said township, according to the existing election laws of this commonwealth.

SECTION 61. That the qualified electors of the township of Decatur, Clearfield, in the county of Clearfield, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of John Goss, in said township.

SECTION 62. From and after the passage of this act, that portion of Lancaster, Penn township, in the county of Lancaster, heretofore included in the seventh election district, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district; and the electors within the bounds thereof shall hold their general elections at the public house of Jacob Hoover, in the borough of Manheim; and all that portion of Penn township, heretofore included in the sixteenth election district, shall be and the same is hereby erected into a separate election district; and the electors within the bounds thereof shall hereafter hold their general election at the public house of Jacob Ziegler, in the village of Litiz: *Provided*, That the qualified voters of the said Penn township, be and they are hereby authorized to hold their spring elections, for township officers, at the house now occupied by Christian Hershey, and that Abraham Kauffman act as judge, and John M. Summy and John H. Spiekler as inspectors, at the next spring election for said township of Penn: *Provided further*, That this act shall not prevent the voters of said Penn township from changing their place of holding the township elections, agreeably to the fifty-sixth section of the act of second July, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, entitled "An Act relating to the elections of this commonwealth."

SECTION 63. That all that portion of the territory now composing the township of Donegal, in the county of Butler, which lies north of a line commencing on the Armstrong county line, and on the line dividing the tracts of Andrew Barnhart and the widow Sylvas; thence westwardly along this line, and as near as may be practicable along the line between those ranges of tracts to the Centre township line, is hereby created into a new election and school district, and into a new township to be called Fairview; and the inhabitants thereof shall hereafter be entitled to all the offices, powers and rights, which are by law conferred upon other townships; and the electors thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by William M'Cafferty, in the town of Fairview; and the electors of Donegal township shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by Denis O'Donal, senior; all taxes heretofore assessed Taxes.

within said townships to be enforced, collected and applied, as if this act had not passed; and the commissioners of said county shall appoint a competent surveyor, who shall run and distinctly mark said division line between said townships of Donegal and Fairview, and return to said commissioners an accurate draft thereof; said surveyor to be paid by said townships, jointly, one dollar and twenty-five cents for each day necessarily spent in said service.

Notice, &c.

SECTION 64. That it shall be the duty of the constable of Donegal township to give notice of the next March election, to be held by virtue of the preceding section, in each of said townships; and in case of deficiency of officers authorized to hold either of said March elections, the electors present at one o'clock of the election day, at the places respectively for holding said next election, shall choose such officers as may be necessary for holding said elections respectively.

Road tax.

SECTION 65. That hereafter it shall be lawful for the supervisors of Middlesex township, in the county of Butler, to collect ten per centum of the road taxes of said township in money; and the compensation of said supervisors shall hereafter be fixed by the auditors of said township at a rate not exceeding six per centum on the whole of said road taxes annually assessed and paid, or worked out; and said supervisors shall annually pay over promptly, to their successors in office, all moneys of said township in their hands.

SECTION 66. That the court of quarter sessions of the county of Butler, shall have power, with the concurrence of the grand jury of said county, to incorporate into boroughs and bodies corporate and politic, the villages of Harrisville and Saxonsburg, in said county, although neither of said villages may contain three hundred inhabitants; the territory to be contained within the limits of each of said boroughs, not to exceed one mile square; and all proceedings may be had relating to the incorporation of said villages into boroughs, which, by existing laws, may be had for the incorporation of villages into boroughs which contain three hundred inhabitants; and if either or both of said villages shall be incorporated into boroughs, the high constables thereof, respectively, shall, after being sworn in, and qualified in court, have all the powers of serving and executing any writ or process, and be subject to all the provisions of law, and all the liabilities of township constables.

SECTION 67. That the officers conducting the ensuing March election for the township of South Butler, in the county of Butler, shall receive from the electors thereof, tickets labelled "election place," and within, either of the words "court house" or "Martin Laurent;" and if a majority of the tickets polled, shall be "Martin Laurent" within, then the general and township elections for said township, shall thereafter be held at the house of said Martin Laurent, senior; otherwise, the said elections shall continue to be held at the court house as heretofore.

SECTION 68. That Burtzinger township, in the county of Elk, be an election district; and that the elections in said township, hereafter, be held at the dwelling house of Ignatius Garner.

SECTION 69. That Benazeet township, in the county of Elk, be an election district; and that the elections in said township shall, hereafter, be held at the dwelling house of Thomas Overturf.

SECTION 70. That the township of Spring Creek, in the county of Elk, shall hereafter be an election district; and that the elections in said township, shall be held at the dwelling house of Job P. Payne.

Do.

SECTION 71. That the township of Jones, in the county of Elk, be an election district; and that the elections shall, hereafter, be held at the dwelling house of Reaselus Brown, in said township.

SECTION 72. That the elections in Ridgway township, in the county Elk. of Elk, shall hereafter be held at the court house in said township.

SECTION 73. That the qualified voters of Springfield township, in the Montgomery. county of Montgomery, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the public house of Samuel Rader, in said township.

SECTION 74. That the qualified electors of the township of French Venango. Creek, in the county of Venango, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at Billingsly school house, at the cross roads, in said township.

SECTION 75. That it shall and may be lawful for the inhabitants of Northampton. Williams township, in the county of Northampton, at the next and subsequent annual election for supervisors, to elect four supervisors of the Elect supervisors. public roads and highways of said township; two of whom shall reside east and two of them west of the old Easton and Philadelphia road; and the said four supervisors shall be elected in the same manner, and be clothed with the like authorities, and be subject to the like duties and penalties, as now by law exists in relation to supervisors of townships.

SECTION 76. That that part of Mount Pleasant township, in the Wayne. county of Wayne, inclosed within the following boundaries, to wit: Beginning at the south-west corner of the borough of Pleasant Mount, and running south to the south line of a tract called the mile square; thence west along said line to Ashbel Allen's land; thence along said Allen's south line to the south-west corner thereof; thence west to the line between Wayne and Susquehanna counties; thence north along said line to the north-west corner of the township of Mount Pleasant; thence east along the north line of said township, one and a half miles, to such point on said line as by running a line due south, will strike the north-west corner of said borough of Pleasant Mount; thence south along the west line of said borough to the place of beginning, be and is hereby made a separate school district, to be known by the name of the north-east school district. School district. and the said district shall be subject to all the provisions and receive all the benefits of the laws enacted relative to common schools.

SECTION 77. That the limits of the borough of Germantown, shall Philadelphia, be confined to the limits of the Lower ward of Germantown, as laid down in the act of the eighth day of February, eighteen hundred and Germantown limits. forty-two; and that so much of the Upper ward of Germantown, as has been incorporated in the borough, be and the same is hereby released and exempt from any borough tax and the government of the said borough: *Provided*, That said exemption and release shall not go into Proviso. effect until on and after the first day of September next.
