AN ACT

Relative to certain election districts.

Philadelphia
county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the qualified electors of the First ward, Moyamensing, in the county of Philadelphia, shall hold their ward elections at the public house now occupied by Charles J. Burns, number two hundred and seventy, South Sixth street, in said ward.

Crawford county.

SECTION 2. That all that part of North Shenango township, in Crawford county, lying north of Shenango creek, where said creek leaves the Sadsbury township line, till the said creek touches the farm of Robert Pollock, and thence due west to the Ohio state line, be and the same is hereby erected into a new township to be called Pine; and the electors shall hereafter hold their elections at the house of C. G. Mayberry, in Linesville.

Crawford county.

SECTION 3. That the qualified voters of North Shenango township, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of John Gaugh, in said township; and the officers of said township elections shall have power to fill any vacancies that may be in the said board at their next general election; and that any vacancies that may occur in said township for justices of the peace, constables, &c., in consequence of the second and third sections of this act, shall be filled according to the existing laws of this commonwealth.

York.

Separate school
district.

SECTION 4. That the qualified electors of the borough of Lewisberry, in the county of York, shall hereafter hold their elections at the house of Joseph Heiser, in said borough; and the said borough shall hereafter be a separate school district, and be entitled to elect by ballot, at the usual time of holding township elections, one assessor, two assistant assessors, and six school directors, two of which shall serve one year, two of which shall serve two years, and two of which shall serve three years, and annually, after said first election, they shall elect two school directors to serve for three years; and the directors so elected shall organize as a board, and be subject to the laws of this commonwealth regulating the common school system.

Washington
county.

SECTION 5. That the qualified electors of East Findley township, Washington county, shall hereafter hold their elections at the house of David Peden, in said township.
