Relative to an increase of justices of the peace in Barre township, Huntingdon county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the electors of Barre township, in the county of Huntingdon, are here-

 on increase. peace in said township, at their next election for constables, in the man-
 Returns. ner directed by the fourth section of the act of the twenty-first of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, relating to the election of such officers, and at the same election to vote for one or two persons, as each elector may decide, to serve as said officers; and if on casting up all the votes on the question of increase, it shall appear that a majority of the qualified electors of said township are in favor of an increase of justices, then the judges of said elections shall compute the votes
 polled for each candidate for justice of the peace, and return as elected the one or the two highest in vote, according as the increase may have been decided as aforesaid, and the person or persons so elected, shall be commissioned and qualified, and have all the powers of justices of the peace in this commonwealth.

A N A C T

Relating to the public roads in Albany township, Berks county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the supervisors of the township of Albany, in the county of Berks, shall not be obliged or compelled to widen the public roads in said township of greater width than their actual width at this time, for a

period of five years: *Provided*, That the supervisors, in their discretion, shall, from time to time, within said period of five years, widen the said roads, as the finances of the township will admit: *And provided also*, That this act shall not effect any suit or prosecution that shall have been or may be brought against the supervisors of said township, before the passage of this act, for not opening the roads within said township, according to existing laws.

AN ACT

Establishing the age at which children may be received into the common schools in the boroughs of Carlisle and Harrisburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That hereafter, the directors of the common schools in the boroughs of Carlisle and Harrisburg, shall not permit the teachers having charge of the several schools in said boroughs, to receive into said schools any child or children under the age of five years, any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
