A SUPPLEMENT

To existing laws in relation to recording of deeds.

Record of official
deeds made evi-
dence in all cases.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* all patents granted by the commonwealth, and all deeds of sheriffs, coroners, marshals and treasurers; and all deeds made in pursuance of a decree of any court being duly acknowledged, may be recorded in the office for recording deeds in the county where the lands lie; and the records thereof, or duly certified copies thereof, shall be evidence in all cases where the original deeds or patents would be evidence; and where any of the deeds aforesaid, have heretofore been recorded in the office for recording deeds in the county where the lands lie, or in the office of the prothonotaries of the several courts of the city and county of Philadelphia, the records thereof or duly certified copies thereof, shall be as good evidence as if the same had been recorded under the provisions of this act.

AN ACT

To legitimize Catharine Sherb, of Lancaster county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Catharine Sherb, daughter of Mary Sherb, of the county of Lancaster, shall possess and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock, and that she shall be able and capable in law to take,
