

SECTION 11. That any justice of the peace of the county of Union, Justices of the peace in Union is hereby authorized to take proof, by the depositions of one or more witnesses, of the original, or a copy of the original draft of the village county, to take of Charleston, in said county, and on such proof being made to the depositions relative to the draft satisfaction of the recorder of deeds of said county, the said draft shall be by him recorded in the office for recording of deeds in said county, and the records of said draft, or duly certified copies thereof, shall in all future time be competent evidence respecting property, streets, alleys or boundaries in said village.

A N A C T

To incorporate the Philadelphia sacred music society.

WHEREAS, The members of the "Philadelphia sacred music society," citizens of this commonwealth, have associated together for the purpose of promoting, by combined effort, the cultivation of the science of music, and have established the following as fundamental articles of their association; therefore, Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every the persons who shall at the time of the passage of this act be members of the association, called and styled, "The Philadelphia sacred music society," in the city and county of Philadelphia, and all such as shall hereafter be admitted as members of the same, agreeably to the by-laws, shall be and they are hereby declared to be, a body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title of "The Philadelphia sacred music society;" and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in all courts of record and elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, hold and enjoy real and personal estate of whatsoever kind or quality, and chuses in action, and the same, from time to time, sell, grant, alien or dispose of; and also, to have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also, to ordain, establish, and put in execution, such by-laws and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or to the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth: Members.
Provided, however, That the clear yearly value or income of the real Name.
and personal estate held by the said corporation, shall not exceed at any time the sum of three thousand dollars. Privileges.
By-laws.
Proviso.

Object. SECTION 2. That the society shall have for its object the promotion of the science of music by the establishment of a musical library, by giving concerts, by promoting schools for instruction in vocal and instrumental music, and by such other modes as the board of managers may deem expedient.

Board of managers. SECTION 3. That the government of this society shall be vested in a board of managers, to be chosen annually, at such time and in such manner as the by-laws may direct, but no failure to elect at the time appointed, shall operate as a forfeiture of this charter. The board of managers shall have entire control over the practicings and performances, have power to fill all vacancies that may occur in their own body, and to establish a system of internal regulation; and also to enact, for the purpose of carrying into effect the objects of the society, such by-laws, rules and regulations, as may be deemed by said board of managers expedient and necessary: *Provided*, The same are not inconsistent with this charter, or with the constitution or laws of this commonwealth, or with those of the United States.

Powers.

Proviso.

Qualification. SECTION 4. That the members of this society shall consist of persons skilled in music, vocal or instrumental, and of persons friendly to the cultivation of the science of music, to be denominated performing and subscribing members. The board of managers shall have power to determine the right and terms of membership, and the privileges of members.

AN ACT

Supplementary to an act passed February twenty-seventh, one thousand eight hundred and one, declaring the rivers Codorus and Conewago, in the county of York, public highways, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

Conewago river declared a public highway. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the portion of said Conewago river, known as the Conewago Gut, be and the same is hereby declared to be part of said highway, and made subject to all the provisions of the law relating thereto.

Limits.

SECTION 2. That said highway shall commence at the mouth of Conewago, where it empties into the river Susquehanna, and terminate at the mill dam of George Emig, in Dover township, York county, below the point where the Bermudian empties into the Conewago.
