

Object. SECTION 2. That the society shall have for its object the promotion of the science of music by the establishment of a musical library, by giving concerts, by promoting schools for instruction in vocal and instrumental music, and by such other modes as the board of managers may deem expedient.

Board of managers. SECTION 3. That the government of this society shall be vested in a board of managers, to be chosen annually, at such time and in such manner as the by-laws may direct, but no failure to elect at the time appointed, shall operate as a forfeiture of this charter. The board of managers shall have entire control over the practicings and performances, have power to fill all vacancies that may occur in their own body, and to establish a system of internal regulation; and also to enact, for the purpose of carrying into effect the objects of the society, such by-laws, rules and regulations, as may be deemed by said board of managers expedient and necessary: *Provided*, The same are not inconsistent with this charter, or with the constitution or laws of this commonwealth, or with those of the United States.

Qualification. SECTION 4. That the members of this society shall consist of persons skilled in music, vocal or instrumental, and of persons friendly to the cultivation of the science of music, to be denominated performing and subscribing members. The board of managers shall have power to determine the right and terms of membership, and the privileges of members.

AN ACT

Supplementary to an act passed February twenty-seventh, one thousand eight hundred and one, declaring the rivers Codorus and Conewago, in the county of York, public highways, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

Conewago river declared a public highway. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the portion of said Conewago river, known as the Conewago Gut, be and the same is hereby declared to be part of said highway, and made subject to all the provisions of the law relating thereto.

Limits.

SECTION 2. That said highway shall commence at the mouth of Conewago, where it empties into the river Susquehanna, and terminate at the mill dam of George Emig, in Dover township, York county, below the point where the Bermudian empties into the Conewago.

SECTION 3. That hereafter it shall be lawful for any person or persons to fish with any net or basket, or in any other manner in said highway, at any time during the months of June, July, August, September, and October: *Provided*, That no net or seine used shall exceed thirty feet in length; that if any person or persons shall erect, repair or aid in erecting or repairing, within the said river hereby declared to be a highway, any wear, rack, basket, fishing dam, pond, or fix any net or nets, or brush, in or across the said river, at any other time than during said months; or if any person or persons having erected or aided in erecting such wear, rack, basket, fishing dam, pond, or having fixed or aided in fixing any net or nets, or brush, in or across the said river, during said months, shall neglect to remove the same before the first day of November, the person or persons so offending, shall, if convicted thereof before a justice of the peace, in the manner prescribed in the act to which this is a supplement, be fined the amount prescribed in the sixth section of said act; one moiety thereof to the informer and the other moiety thereof to the supervisor of the highways of the township, for the use of the township within which the offence was committed.

SECTION 4. That hereafter the duties enjoined upon the supervisors of said river, thus made a public highway by the act to which this is a supplement, shall devolve upon and be performed by the supervisors of the townships through which said highway passes, who shall be paid for their services out of the township rates and levies: *Provided*, That in cases where any part of said highway is or shall bound more than one township, the supervisor of either of said townships within which any offence may be committed, may proceed against any person or persons offending against the provisions of this act, or the act to which this is a supplement: *Provided further*, That an offender shall be liable to but one proceeding for any one offence, which shall be recovered in the suit or proceeding first instituted.

SECTION 5. That hereafter no person or persons, under the penalty prescribed in the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement, shall erect, build, set up or repair, or aid in erecting, building, setting up or repairing any wear, rack, basket, fishing dam, pond, or fix or fasten any net or nets, or brush, in the river Susquehanna, at the mouth of said highway, so as to prevent the fish from entering said river Conewago.

Penalty for fishing at mouth of highway.

SECTION 6. If any person or persons shall throw into said highway the carcass of any dead animal, or tops or branches of trees, the person or persons so offending shall be liable to a fine of five dollars, to be recovered and applied in the manner hereinbefore prescribed.

Nuisances.

SECTION 7. So much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.
