

gers of the said company may determine, to an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars, in addition to the present capital of said company: *Provided*, That this act shall not go into effect until the said company assent thereto, and certify the same to the governor, by resolutions passed at any general meeting of the stockholders.

SECTION 2. That so much of the sixth section of an act, entitled "A supplement to the several acts incorporating the Northern Liberties and Penn Township railroad company," the "Mine Hill and Schuylkill Haven railroad company," the "president and managers of the Danville and Pottsville railroad company," the "Mount Carbon railroad company," the "Little Schuylkill navigation, railroad and coal company," the "Little Schuylkill and Susquehanna railroad company," and the "Schuylkill Valley navigation and railroad company," and to the several supplements thereto, approved the third day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, as authorizes said Mine Hill and Schuylkill Haven railroad company, to charge a rate of tolls of two and a half cents per ton per mile for the transportation of coal over the road of the said company, be and the same is hereby repealed, and said Mine Hill and Schuylkill Haven railroad company shall not have power to charge a greater rate of toll than one and an half cents per ton per mile, on all coal transported over any portion of the railroad belonging to said company: *Provided*, That the provisions of this section shall not take effect until one year from and after the passage of this act: *Provided further*, That whenever the aforesaid tolls shall exceed fifteen per cent. on the capital expended, they shall be reduced so as not to exceed that amount: *And provided further*, That the charge for weighing shall not exceed one-half cent. per ton.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Farmers' Bank of Schuylkill county."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the capital stock authorized to be subscribed in the first-section of the act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Farmers' Bank of Schuylkill county," passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred

and forty-five, be reduced to one hundred thousand dollars, to be divided into two thousand shares of fifty dollars each.

Time for election changed. SECTION 2. That the time mentioned in the third section of the said act for the election of directors to manage the affairs of the said bank, be and the same is hereby extended to the third Monday of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six; and that each and every act of the commissioners named in the first section of said act, relative to the opening of the books for the subscription of stock, and the stock subscribed in pursuance thereof, be and the same is hereby declared to be null and void; and that so much of the first section of the said act as provides that the said bank "to be located at Schuylkill Haven, in the county of Schuylkill, within the original town plot," be and the same is hereby repealed; and that the said bank be located in the borough of Schuylkill Haven, in the county of Schuylkill, on the east side of the river Schuylkill.

AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of the county of Chester to borrow money.

Commissioners authorized to borrow money. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of the county of Chester are hereby authorized and empowered to borrow any sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole, twenty thousand dollars, which they may deem necessary for the purpose of erecting a court house and public offices, at any rate of interest not exceeding six per cent., in the name, and upon the faith, credit, and responsibility of the said county; to issue certificates of such loans to the holders thereof, in sums not less than one hundred dollars each, and to make such provision out of the taxes of the said county,
